

# Nepal - The first International project

The first International project of the Rotary Club of Denver Mile High was a water project in a village in Nepal visited by 2 of our members, **Patricia Fiske** who employed **Ram Tamang** as a guide on a trek and then later by **Nan O'Dell** as she also employed Ram. They were so impressed with Ram that after visiting his village they brought the project to our club and it became our initial international project. I believe this project helped to create the culture which has encouraged our club to become a leader in the international project arena. The following is a note which Tatwa Timsina, our main contact at the Rudramati Rotary Club in Katmandu wrote to me after he and members of the ICA Nepal visited the village to see the devastation from the earthquake.

"I will be sharing this report to our DG also as for me it is one of the most successful projects that I have ever visited. Please share this report to all who were involved in this project. It is also good to share to every one, who believes on



'small contribution can bring big change'. " Tatwa P. Timsina, Co-Chair, District Project Link Committee, Nepal Rotary – 3292.

The full report and photos are attached here, but this is an excerpt from Tatwa's report. The village is relatively clean and prosperous, as compared to other villages in Nepal. However, this was not the situation until 1993 AD (2050 BS) when Rotary Club of Denver Miles High came in contact with one of the villagers Mr. Ram Bd Tamang, during a trek trip. The club assessed the high need of drinking water in the village and with the collaboration of Rotary club of Patan and villagers of Thulo Parsel, drinking water taps were provided in the village in 2053 AD (1996 AD). With total 26000 USD expenses, the project provided drinking water pipes and taps for individual household. (Con't next page).

The materials were transported via rafting as there was no road access then. After the reach of drinking water, Rotary Club of Patan further helped to construct toilets in each individual household. Hence, every household have drinking water accessibility and toilet facility now. Later, government of Nepal also added few taps water which fully solved the drinking water problem in the village. After availability of water, agriculture also flourished rapidly in the village. A villager shared, "Had not there been reach of water, there wouldn't be a single green tree or vegetable in village."

Therefore, the condition of village transformed highly in prosperity through

this very initiation of drinking

water.

Even before that, villagers were comparatively much forward and liberal in terms awareness and empowerment, but access to drinking water changed their lives completely. After a huge earthquake in



April 2015, the village got a lot of damages in houses and lost some animals too. Out of 160 damaged households, 60 are totally unsafe to stay whereas 100 of them are in need of urgent repair. People are living on tarpaulins and temporary shelter. They have received NPR 15 thousand from government for repairment as per governments support for victims. This amount is not enough, so local people are expecting some support from generous people and organisations.



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
