NEXT MEETING - GUEST SPEAKER

Michelle Enbom - Disability Coordinator, Marlborough Unit Port Phillip Prison

"Intellectual Disability in the Adult Justice System"

Those with intellectual disabilities are one of the most marginalised groups within prisons; they find it more difficult to transition to the community than other prisoners and find themselves coming back into the justice system at a greater rate than other groups.

The Disability Unit at Port Phillip Prison provides a therapeutic environment where those that go through the program can learn new ways of living so that when they go back into the community they create no more victims.

Michelle manages a unit of intellectually disabled offenders at the maximum security Port Phillip Prison. She is a Churchill Fellow awarded through the Winston Churchill Trust and recently returned from overseas where she visited other prisons that work with offenders with an intellectual disability.

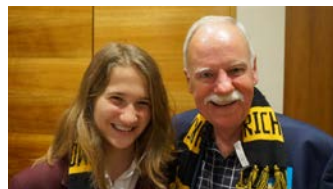
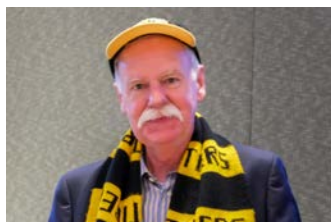

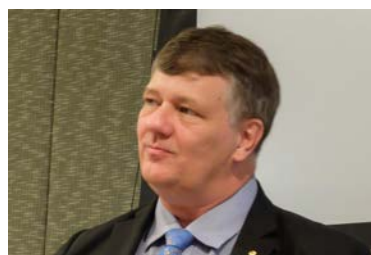

Richard Dent (OAM)

Chief Executive at Leadership Victoria

"Leading Ethically in Complex Times"

Leadership Victoria brings together business, government and civic leaders to bring about change. It runs the Williamstown Leadership Program, the Joan Kirner Program for Women as well as a series of other programs.



Richard presented an interesting subject and engaged the audience with the following key messages:

- All progress comes from experiencing discomfort. The corollary is that if we feel comfortable, we are probably not making progress, i.e. staying out of the comfort zone.
- Leadership is about making swifter, better progress on complex issues.
- His definition of leadership is "Mobilizing people towards important outcomes in order to thrive."
- Leadership is an activity, it's not a role. It does not necessarily depend on authority to act. Richard gave examples of VicPol working with leaders in the African community.

Richard presented several scenarios and challenged the audience to share their opinions to demonstrate the ethical issues that underpin every important leadership decision.

This was an engaging presentation and as with all ethical questions, Richard was careful to point out that as they are based on values, they are neither right nor wrong. However the decisions still must be made.

Announcements:

- Rob Hines is leading a group of Rotarians on Thursday to say thanks to the residents at Highvale Retirement Village, Glen Waverley, who have been making clothing and blankets for Melbourne's homeless people.
- Stuart Ellis visited MacRobertson Girls High School to conduct a practice interview of Emma Crowley, who is our National Youth Science Forum candidate.
- Peter Duras informed members that Caprice have donated 6 cartons of clothing for distribution to disadvantaged families. We will be donating in turn to Shine for Kids to assist children who are growing up with a parent in prison.

- Frank O'Brien reported that Dick Mitchell had resigned due to ill health. Dick is a Paul Harris Fellow and a charter member of our club.

"Opportunities for Rotary at Princes Hill Secondary College" - Margaret Fry

PHSC was established in 1889 to cater for migrant groups. It now 884 students and it uses Princes Park for sports and general activities and links with Melbourne University for teacher training. Music is a large component of the school life with 370 students engaged. The students perform 60 concerts per year with 17 ensembles.

We have provided an opportunity for PHSC students to attend the annual PhillipsConoco Science Experience, supported by the Wolfgang and Monika Jacobs Trust. We were successful with a candidate in 2017 and are repeating the program in 2018.

Saskia Van Dijk, a Year 11 student attended the RYPEN camp on 28-29 April. Saskia spoke briefly on her experience.

We have also provided financial assistance for four year 11 students, which has providing resources such as computers and text books for financially disadvantaged students.

Margaret especially thanked Frank O'Brien, Bernie Gerlinger and Stuart Ellis for their valuable assistance.

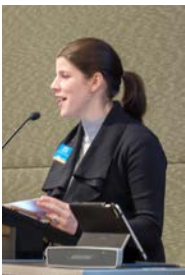
