Gerry Philips Rotary Oceanic Medical Aid for Children (ROMAC)

ROMAC began as part of an outreach team of volunteer surgeons and back up staff which went to Fiji to treat local children with cleft palates or lips. They found there were many children too sick to be treated where they lived. ROMAC began when Rotary clubs in Victoria began sponsoring children from the Pacific region to be brought to Australia for treatment by some of our most eminent surgeons who generously donated their services. There are tight parameters on the number of cases which can be treated due to



constraints on resources and capacity. A key benefit is the experience surgeons and staff acquire from treating conditions not usually seen in Australia. The big challenge is finding funds to continue the program with increased costs and a never ending demand for places for patients from our neighbours in the Pacific.

Gerry Phillips is Chairman of the District 9800 ROMAC Committee, and has been involved with ROMAC for since 2009. He has been a member of the Rotary Club of Albert Park for 17 years, has had numerous roles and was that Club's president in 2001-02. That was the year that Albert Park's Ann White was District Governor, and Gerry played a leading role in the preparation and conduct of the District Conference on Mt Bulla. A retired insurance broker, Gerry is married to Sharon. They have three adult children and one grandchild.

Sergeant Bernie started to hit people up for the usual fines then realised he did not have much time allocated so there was only one fine - for Allan Driver enjoying his birthday today at our club breakfast "Happy Birthday Allan"

Guest Speaker – Elio D'Amato (CEO of Lincoln) "Talking Stocks"

Elio started by giving a short history of Lincoln and the founder Dr Merv Lincoln and reported that they now look after \$220 million in managed funds. Elio gave an excellent presentation and had everyone interested in what shares are "hot and what is not" using punch phrases like "Blue and green is were you want to be seen" referring to his charts and showing how investors want to be in a strong and satisfactory growth position and with low risk shares.

Elio gave a thorough overview of the stock market and the issues that should be important to investors. For example, he raised many questions and delivered his answers confidently, posing questions like "What to like about the market now?" then carefully articulating his rationale to invest and what to invest in. According to Elio, the main issue is that income investment will be a



strong driver for the market going forward, "our currency is weakening therefore the positive is that there will be more foreign investment". Others considerations include:

- Energy and commodity prices have fallen, expect to hear more about capital infrastructure investments, and
- World recovering economically
- Great businesses can be found and challenged businesses/sector easily avoided
