Victoria. Their aim is to improve the health, wellbeing and equity for women of the Loddon Mallee region with a strategic focus on sexual and reproductive health, prevention of violence against women, and gender equity.

Women's Health Loddon Mallee's vision is to achieve gender equality across the Loddon Mallee Region by addressing gender inequities and the determinants of women's health through leadership, advocacy, gender transformative practice, working in partnership, and supporting cultural change.

Tricia stressed that health is an asset for everyday living. Gender equity is good for everyone, and is the core driver towards the prevention of illness, disadvantage and violence that exists.

She encouraged everybody to listen through the gender lens. Let's walk in a females shoes and identify what barriers exist in society. These could include family violence, family care, and how gender equality has impacted females in relation to Superannuation accumulation and home ownership.

Some of the biggest challenges facing the service are the vast area that the service tries to cover, the diverse indigenous and ethnic groups involved and dealing with many different local Government authorities.

The total population of the area serviced by Women's Health Loddon Mallee is approximately 324,000, with more than 50% (165,000) being female. Almost one-fifth of the population is born overseas and the region is diverse in language, culture and religion.

Dealing with a significant settlement program for Korean refugees to the Bendigo region is one recent task that has been undertaken.

As a final message, she said that we need to "look to see, and once you see, you cannot un-see".
