



MEETING REPORT 7th JUNE 2016

Chairman of the day, Neil Salvano proposed the toast to Rotary International.

President George then welcomed Sarah Overton for the last time as a guest, pending her induction. He also welcomed her husband David Duncan, a guest of Warwick Cavill's in Leigh Jones and friend of the Club, Des Benjamin.

Announcements:

The Chairman announced there would be a ballot to decide on a change in the club name. Other announcements included:

- Roger Thornton reminding members that the
 Police Graduation Breakfast is on Tuesday
 21 June and he needs to know who will be in
 attendance, either by an entry in Club Runner
 or an email. Also, whilst a majority have
 confirmed their attendance at the Club's
 changeover dinner scheduled for Friday July
 1, those who have not registered should do so
 promptly.
- Roy Garrett advised that his wife Annie had returned home following successful surgery and is in good spirits, although she will still faces a period of chemo therapy. He thanked members for their good wishes and support.

Special General Meeting, Change of Club Name:

Secretary and Returning Officer Neil noted that 27 members were present and in excess of a quorum which required 15 members. He then conducted a ballot on the motion to change the Club name to Rotary Central Melbourne. The motion was passed with 25 approvals whilst 2 were against. President George thanked the Board and the members for their support in accepting the change, noting that change is always a difficult process.

New Member Induction:

President George asked Sarah Overton and her husband David to come forward and conducted her induction into the Club as a new member. He also welcomed David as her partner into the Rotary

family. Neville Taylor, who will act as mentor, pinned on Sarah's membership badge and offered his congratulations. Similarly Peter Duras as chair of the Community Services Team welcomed Sarah. All members stood welcoming Sarah and David by acclamation.
