Bill Oakley

Making a Difference - Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM)



Bill has been heavily involved in the Rotary Club of North Balwyn's activities in the Solomon Islands for 15 years, which cover a broad range of projects. Sanitation, improving food, and other more direct efforts in the fight against malaria, have been prominent. Bill is now in his 5th year as the D9800 District Coordinator for Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM). Bill referred to Malaria as the next big thing

When Rotary launched its fight against polio back in the early 1980's, there were 365,000 new cases of polio each year. Now, with any luck there will be none in the coming year, and we will be able to declare the fight against polio won. Even though Rotary and worldwide partnerships which includes the World Health Organisation, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and the Gate/Buffet partnership the Global Fund, and

the US Centre for Communicable Diseases have achieved great advances in rolling malaria back, it still remains the most damaging disease to humankind in the world. Three billion people live in countries where malaria is endemic. There are some 200 million new cases of malaria each year and almost 500,000 people die from malaria each year-mostly pregnant women and children under the age of 5. Malaria is the most costly disease in the world in terms of lives lost and illness caused, and also in terms of lost economic production.

Bill and RAM urges Rotary to take up the fight against malaria, and do our part in seeing its eradication by 2040.
