Hot Desking: Busting the Myth!

(Does it save money and is it good for workforce productivity?)

Hot desking means unassigned desks for staff. Each day a person is potentially at a different desk i.e. they do not have their own desk. It can save on property costs and overheads. Hot desking is also seen as a key component of Activity Based Working.

Activity Based Working is a new model which is designed to provide workspaces that are suitable for different types of tasks e.g. team work, creative problem solving and intense focused research.

The 'ABW' model relies on staff moving to the area that bests suits the task they are doing on that day. Unassigned desks allow an organisation to maximize the use of its available space. There are many assertions about what this does for the financial management of the business but limited information on what this does to staff.

Job talk - Kevin Walklate:

Australia Post is a government-owned corporation, employing 37,000 people. There are 4,400 outlets throughout Australia. Kevin is a retail planner which includes analysing demographics of areas to determine whether to open retail outlets and the design and operation of those outlets. He also advises on rental and fit-out for the outlets.

Mail volumes have reduced but parcel post has increased. This has created more demand for back-of-shop space.

The new Managing Director has adopted an aggressive approach to improving services through use of technology. Kevin is confident that this will contribute to the ongoing success of the organisation.

Guest speaker - Kenneth Park: Topic, A Snapshot of Eastern Canada



Kenneth is a lecturer in art and architecture. He travels for about six months of the year. He leads tours around the world and he spoke to the club about Eastern Canada - Nova Scotia, Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island and the mighty St. Lawrence River.

Toronto was an early centre for trade and today is a beautiful city. It was also the seat of British government until the mid 19th century. Montreal today is the largest French-speaking city outside France. It attracts French scholars from around the world to study the language spoken in a different way from the language spoken in France. Kenneth spoke about

the variety of architecture in the capital, Ottawa.

Quebec City is one of the most beautiful cities in North America and is one of the few remaining walled cities. It was the bastion of French society and the original capital of New France.

Captain James Cook journeyed to North America and drew the original maps of Newfoundland. His maps have since been shown to be incredibly accurate when compared to images taken from space.

Canada is an interesting mix of cultures from the indigenous people, the early French and later the British. These cultures are codified in the Canadian constitution.

Kenneth's presentation was wonderfully descriptive about art and culture and the history of Eastern Canada.
