- Stuart E advised the Club he had attended the NSW Rotary Community Awards for Emergency Service personnel and this was planned to be replicated nationally, including Victoria in 2020.

Speaker – TLC for Kids

Our speakers at the 13 August meeting were **Michael Luddeni and Niar (sp) talking about TLC for kids which with eight staff in Melbourne services hospitals across Australia with local referrals from health care professionals.** TLC for Kids have been working behind the scenes since 1998 to provide practical, emotional and distractional support to sick children and their families. This is about to include an Ambulance in Victoria, delivering special moments to children in palliative care by transporting them to wherever they wish for the day.

Michael emphasised the very inclusive approach to all that seek TLC for Kids assistance, which generally comes in the form of 'Distraction Boxes' and practical support through Rapid TLC'. There are a recorded 998,000pa with repeated use of these services. The cost per impact is \$1.38.
