This Week's Speaker, Tues September 7th by LOVE, Kevin

Detective Acting Superintendent Patrick Boyle APM

Pat has 34 years experience as a police officer, 25 years of his service as a detective at all ranks within mainly crime squads and has specialist investigative experience in the area of kidnapping, extortion, aggravated burglary and in particular Asian Crime and Youth Gangs. He was recognized



in the 2003 Queens Birthday Honours Listed for his extensive service to the investigation of crime and his volunteer work with the Victoria Police Blue Ribbon Foundation of which he is a Director and Life Member, by receiving the Australian Police Medal.

In 2005 he was awarded a Winston Churchill Fellowship to undertake a research project - "Community Policing Strategies to prevent the further entrenchment of criminal youth gangs". His studies were undertaken in the USA, UK, Hong Kong and Canada, working with the relevant police forces and other non government agencies.

Pat has been recognized as an authority on this issue and has have been invited to speak at various forums conducted nationally and in New Zealand on the subject of "Identifying Gang Presence": His paper which is available on the Churchill website has been read by numerous Law Enforcement Agencies, local and overseas and he has been complimented as to its accuracy.

He is currently undertaking a Masters of Research; his thesis on the subject of identifying youth gang characteristics and its link to gang membership has not been previously undertaken in Australia.

Highlights from the August Meeting

Club Rules and Constitution

District committee is currently meeting with solicitors and agreeing the changes. We are hopeful of having changes finalised for presentation to Board by October and club at AGM in November

GSE Incoming team from Texas

Team expected mid March 2011 for one month. This will Clash with District conference and our members travelling to Osaka sister club anniversary. The club has regretfully agreed that we would not seek to host this team.

Marketing and Fund Raising

Current draft budget shows funding shortfall \$20,000. Our target for fundraising is to be \$25,000. Several fundraising ideas are being explored and emphasis on identifying a major event. Formalising club calendar dates will assist planning of fundraising activities. The board has initially agreed to commence a quarterly Trivia night from October, although it is likely to be only 3 during the year.

Community Service

Committee is looking to establish a Probus Club for central Melbourne. There is no Probus club operating in this area. It would involve no ongoing obligation for our club as the new club would be self governing and financing. Tony Thomas is organising a letterbox drop and an initial meeting in Docklands in November.

International Committee

The club has provided for two family survival packs at cost of AUD800 in relation to the Pakistan Floods, each to be delivered through Disaster Aid Australia (DAA). Using DAA this time is considered a trial of the new organisation. Neither Shelterbox nor Disaster Aid Australia organisation is endorsed by the Board at this stage and we are waiting for district to give us guidance.

New Generations

Committee is looking to leverage the skills of past and present Police mentorees with a view to assisting disadvantaged youth. Fund raising events are also being investigated

Vocational Service

'Students for Free Enterprise' and 'Skills Bank' projects are progressing. Committee is looking to contribute via their skill and energy resources.

Committee's plans and objectives have been approved, these have been posted on the website.
