Meeting Report, Tues April 12th by Neville JOHN

Sergeant's Session: Sergeant Gillian Farrell was captivated by Egypt, having recently been there and all questions were related thereto.

Announcements

Alan Seale reminded members that International House is holding its Cafe International '20's Murder Mystery' night on Saturday 7th May 2011. Tickets are \$80pp inclusive of 3 course meal and beverages. Dress Code: Black Tie. RSVP 22nd April 2011. Alan also outlined more detail on the District process for anyone wishing to donate to the NZ Earthquake appeal.

Bernie Gerlinger advised that raffle tickets have been distributed (2 booklets per member). It is important that we raise money this year, and we are trying to source funding from beyond our members. Please sell tickets to friends, work colleagues, parish and local communities. We have also organised dates to sell tickets at shopping centres for which Bernie has created a schedule. He still needs more volunteers to fill this. We need to sell 300 books to make a profit of \$10,000 and need to sell 100 books to break even. Bernie asked members to advise him about their availability to sell raffle tickets at the venues that he has secured.

Kevin Love reported on the visit to RC Osaka Hommachi's 20th anniversary.

Guest Speaker

The guest speaker was Geoffrey Bardwell who is the media spokesperson for Amnesty International in Victoria. His topic of discussion was - "Refugees: A human rights issue"

Geoffrey commenced by asking the rhetorical questions about human rights - What are they? Who enforces them? Are they Universal? The answers to these unfolded during his presentation. The point was made that declarations about human rights and independence date back to 1776 with the US Declaration of Independence declaring amongst other things that all men were created equal. Another declaration was the abolishment of slavery in 1884.

Geoffrey pointed out that unfortunately it was not until 1920 in the USA that women were granted the right to vote and that declarations around the world had historically been aspirational rather than realistic and fell a long way short of their objective.

Please visit our Club Website Sponsors. To place your ad click here. On the subject of asylum seekers and refugees, it was noted that the terms refugee and asylum seeker were often misused. Amnesty International hold the view that in the first instance a person seeks asylum from whatever events are occurring in their homeland by applying for refuge in another country. Geoffrey explained that Amnesty International when assessing the human rights of asylum seekers do not believe their mode of arrival (boat, plane, passport or no passport) warrants that they be treated like a common criminal, and that whether a person was deserving of refuge was a political matter not a human rights consideration. Their primary concern is with how these people are treated in our care from a human rights perspective. Amnesty believes that the measurement of a country's processing of refuge claims should be based on how that country treats the most vulnerable members of its community.

Geoffrey advised that, depending on the many definitions used, there are between 8 and 60 million people in the world seeking refuge in another country and that the driving causes were wars in Afghanistan, Iraq, Somalia and Burma. Australia processed 13,750 refugee claims in 2010 ranking it as 51 in the world for the intake of refugees, with Sweden being ranked first. The countries who are signatories to the convention on refugees in the Pacific region are Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Fiji, Samoa and the Solomon Islands.

The community is polarised on the subject of refugees because of sensationalist media reporting, which then has the potential to impact Government policy. Amnesty receives allegations from refugees ranging from verbal abuse, threats, bullying, punishment and intimidation. Amnesty assess whether a country treats refugees better, the same or worse than the local criminals.

In Australia, refugees are still being processed under the 1958 Immigration Act and an application for a protection visa costs \$1,400.
