Guest Speakers

International Report

Alan Driver outlined the achievements of the International Committee:

- 12 members and partners supporting the people power needs of the Steam Rally run by our Sister Club Echuca-Moama;
- Alan Driver, tour leader of the District 9800 trip to Turkey and presentation of items to a School for the Blind by participants;
- The Committee had successfully raised \$6,000 for the Club at 2 special breakfasts;
- Friendship Exchange;
- Water filter supplied to Laos;
- \$1,600 had been provided for health awareness leaflets in PNG;
- One working bee at DIK, Brooklyn and a donation of \$3,000 to support DIK lease cost and \$500 to partly subsidise a container of goods to East Africa;
- Continual evaluation of possible projects in the Philippines and contribution from our Sister Club Osaka Hommachi to that project amounting to \$US5,000;
- Formation of a Friendship club with a club in Manilla;
- 2 Disaster Aid Survivor packs had been funded;
- 2 impregnated mosquito nets provided to PNG in conjunction with Rotary Against Malaria program;
- Strengthened relationship with International House through support of a prize award, attendance at Cafe International, encouraging students to attend RCCM-S breakfasts and provision of \$1,000 towards funding specialized counseling service; and
- Ongoing liaison with our two sister clubs, Echuca Moama and Osaka Hommachi.

Osaka Hommachi celebrations

Paul Maguire reported on the recent delegation of himself and Harumi, John and Lorraine Meehan, Frank & Pauline O'Brien, Herb and Leonie Greenwood and Kevin and Veronica Love in conjunction with the 20th Anniversary of the Osaka Hommachi Club. Despite being overshadowed and curtailed as a result of the tragic earthquake and tsunami north of Tokyo, the dinner at the Rihga Royal Hotel which was catered by a renowned Royal Chef had been a great night. Our club presented a polished wooden box made from Victorian timbers around Warrandyte to mark the anniversary. Paul's talk was illustrated by a series of slides of the night depicting magnificent scenery, people and temple shots marking the subsequent tour; from one slide it is obvious that although the trend started in Japan, Melbourne can apparently cram more commuters into a train.

At the conclusion of his presentation Paul presented Anne with the formally signed agreement from Osaka Hommachi to contribute \$US5,000 to our Philippines project.

Philippines Project

Paul Maguire provided an outline on current progress in the Philippines, which had been frustratingly slow, it now appears likely to focus on educational scholarships to enable students to study therapeutic massage and establish small businesses in that field and in turn provide hands-on help to students.
