The meeting chair Michael Wells opened the meeting with the loyal toast and Rotary Grace.

President Kevin Walklate welcomed visiting Rotarians and guests: Bob Aitken RDU Executive Director and member of the RC Upper Blue Mountains and Gillian Hibbins RC Melbourne and Guest Speaker for the day.

Sergeant's Session

Ed Stockdale extended the members' knowledge of Shakespeare by quoting a line and then asking the name of the play in which it featured. The success rate for naming the play was less than 50% and we all should have taken note of the song from the Cole Porter musical "Kiss Me Kate" and "Brush up Your Shakespeare."

Club Announcements Roy Garrett announced he is planning to take a group from the Club to Laos to help renovate a High School in Luang Prabang in 2012.

It will be very much hands-on for about 8 days and there will be plenty of time allocated for sight-seeing as well. This is an opportunity to help a very disadvantaged group of people who are 'some of the loveliest people in the world." Roy has estimated that the cost would be less than A\$6,000 per person including all 4-star accommodation, air fares and is now preparing an itinerary. You can contact Roy or Annie for a facts sheet giving a full description of the project and the extended sight-seeing that will be conducted in a World Heritage area. They will also be able to answer any questions you might have.

Neil Salvano announced that the Club needs to sell the last 6 tickets for the RC Rochester Flood Relief and this was completed at the end of the meeting.

Bob Aitken advised that Rotary Down Under would be going on line and this would represent substantial savings in print costs for those opting for the electronic version. There is also be a "Rotarians in Business" section which identifies businesses run by Rotarians.

Michael Wells invited members to attend the New Generations Committee meeting at the Rose Hotel on 13 August. This invitation is extended to all members of the Club. Further details can be obtained from Michael.

Kevin Love announced that there would be a Special Breakfast Meeting to be held on 11 September with Andrew McLeod.

Andrew is from the Committee for Melbourne and he impressed the Club with his presentation a few weeks ago. He will speak on "The Principles for Social Investment Secretariat". Just as Geneva is the home to the Olympic Games Federation and FIFA (football's governing body), it is hoped that Melbourne would be the location for a world body supporting philanthropic organisations, foundations and other organisations in the advancement of social investment around the world.

Guest Speaker Gillian Hibbins - Author.

Gillian said she felt it was important that Victorians know about the start of Australian Rules Football as it had begun in Melbourne and there were many misconceptions about it.

It began in 1859, not 1858, and is older than soccer or rugby. Current research shows that it was not influenced by Irish or Indigenous football although the Aboriginals played different games of their own around the colony.

The gold rushes brought thousands of young men to the colony in the 1850s, many of whom must have had experience of football in England

where games were played but only with rules agreed before each game. Similarly in 1858 occasional games had been played within the Colony and there was a St. Kilda team and a South Yarra team.

Tom Wills, prominent young cricketer, suggested in a letter to the local sporting paper that a football club be formed and, for this reason, it is misguidedly asserted he founded our game. It was the publican at the hotel in Wellington Parade, Jerry Bryant, who provided a football and inspired six games played that spring near the MCG. These were chaotic and it was agreed that rules were necessary.

At the start of the winter in 1859 about fifty young men formed the Melbourne Football Club, and three days afterwards at Jerry's hotel, on 17 May, four of them wrote 10 rules which formed the basis for the code we now have. They were journalists James Thompson and William Hammersley, Scotch College teacher Tom Smith, and Tom Wills. Tom Wills was keen to introduce Rugby School football which he had played in England but the older men were not keen on Rugby School's rough play or complicated offside rules. Ultimately they settled on rules which suited Victoria's dry conditions and the two journalists were significant in propagating these and getting them widely accepted. The Rules have, of course, changed and continued to change over the years.

NOMINATIONS CALLED FOR GSE TEAM <u>MEMBERS</u> TO INDIA and/or USA

Nominations are being called for throughout our District for Rotarians to nominate young professionals 25-40 years of age to apply to be a GSE Team <u>Member.</u>

Applicants must not be a current Rotarian but, with recent change, may be a relative of a Rotary member. They must be an Australian citizen.

Two GSE Teams are being supported by District next year to travel for 4 weeks to either:

* Central India (District 3030) – leaves 14th January 2012 – home on 15th February 2012

* Central California, USA (District 5230) – leaves 22nd April 2012 – home on 22nd May 2012

Teams are composed of 4 members, usually of various business and professional backgrounds and one experienced Rotarian Leader.

Team members can come from corporations, small businesses, community organisations, medical and educational facilities, government offices and not-for-profit agencies.

They must be currently employed full-time and must have worked in their vocational field for at least 2 years by the time of application. They must either be employed or reside within District 9800.

Applications close for Team Members to District 3030-India on 19th September 2011 and for District 5230- USA on 14th November 2011.
