Guest Speaker

Phil Rutheven gave an informative presentation on the economy with particular emphasis on the post GFC world. Phil had an optimistic outlook, particularly for the Australian economy over the next few years. He presented some compelling statistics to support his optimism including the anticipated growth of Australia's trading partners in Asia, the standard of living enjoyed in this country and the relatively small size of our public debt.

He acknowledged that there are still some serious problems facing the world economy and that there are countries in a dire situation because of the size of their public debt - in particular Japan, Italy, Spain, Greece, Portugal, Iceland and Ireland. Whilst Phil acknowledged the seriousness of these issues he claimed that the world was not facing desperate times and that there was no reason strong economies could not continue to have average growth rates of 8% or more.

Phil presented data on consumer sentiment and commented on the national psyche of various countries. He also spoke about the Australian Economic Cycle, forecasting that the next big dip in the cycle should not be until 2019, and that Australia's cycle tends to be 8.5 years in length. During his discussion on this aspect of the economy he claimed that our economic downturn related to a reduction in industry CAPEX and not consumer spending.
