Guest Speakers

"The Lighter Side of Living in a War Zone"

In line with Anzac Day, Ed Stockdale invited his fellow Vietnam Veterans Roger Herrod, Rod Dally, Gary Maulton, and Phil Brookes to share their experiences of the Vietnam War, but focusing on the lighter side of living in a war zone, in Vung Tau 1967-68.

Ed Stockdale started the session sharing his 'mis-capade' during the R&C (Rest in Country) with Rod which he described as his good time and scariest time. The good time was the many beers Roger bought him for each goal that Carlton kicked against Essendon (who were playing at the time) and the Scariest time when he missed curfew later that night and was thrown into the brig.

Each veteran had variations of this story, including the story of Horatio the inappropriate monkey and a lively rendition of "Cheap Charlie" which was sung in many bars to the tune of 'Nick nack paddy wack give a dog a bone) and you get a picture of soldiers finding ways of bringing levity and camaraderie into this very scary world.

Rod's story summed up the experience of the veterans, "... it takes a bit of getting over the things you see in a place like that... and when you get back to civilization, you change. A couple of things that came out of it: One is I know myself very well, what I can do and what I can't do, who I am and what I am. And the other thing I made of it is life-long friends."
