Pike Peters, President RC of Docklands

"Solar Smiles Dental Charity"

Pike Peters is President of the Rotary Club of Docklands (RCD), a proud sponsor of the Solar Smiles Dental Charity. RCD is a small club, struggling for members but punching above their weight - they initiated the "Festival of Giving" in Docklands. These projects help them connect with a wider community.

Oral hygiene is a problem around the world. Member Kim Groizard promoted the project for Cambodia, and in 2015 the project SOLAR SMILES Dental Charity was born with the support of the Rotary Club of Docklands. They identified a need in Cambodia, particularly in remote regions.

SOLAR SMILES located a portable solar powered backpack dental chair and equipment (from a US charity organisation). This meant dental treatment could be taken to communities, in a single back pack, rather than them having to travel extensively to cities (or simply miss out).



In January, 2017, the first group travelled to Cambodia with the packs and an Australian dentist, and delivered over \$134,000 worth of dental treatment to Cambodian children and young people, many of whom had never received dental treatment before. The project also sources toothbrushes and toothpaste to distribute. Did you know that a simple toothbrush and tube of toothpaste cost the equivalent of AUD422.80 when compared against a rural salary/income in Cambodia.

Pike brought with him a sample of the portable pack, weighing 14kg, it can be carried to remote areas as a back-pack; it is simple, robust and easy to use.

The Club has sourced two more chairs that are on their way to Nepal to support rural communities with dental health in that country.

On May 20th, the club is planning a small wine auction, a social event. Then later in year (October) a larger auction. The team is also considering projects with our indigenous community.

NYSF Presentation

Our nominee to National Youth Science F, Metta Chalapati presented her feedback and thanks to the club.

Metta described her attendance at NYSF in Canberra for 12 days, part of the >10,000 alumni since it began. She was part of the **NEWTON** group (Ed: obviously а group with gravitas), that visited the space



telescope; and Metta pointed out the learning that would not occur in everyday school. They visited the National Computing Infrastructure (NCI), and at ANU saw and experienced a "complete silence – no echo" room. They gained perspective on STEMM and the careers available, and were able to explore Canberra as well. Metta was fascinated by the critical thinking lecture. Overall it was an eye opening experience.

Metta thanked the club and told us that her planned career in engineering was prompted by her NYSF experience.
