

<u>Directors Report</u> - "Vocational Services" - Justine Murphy (D9800 Vocational Chair)

 Overview of the Vocational Framework and Strategic Plan developed by her D9800 Vocational Service team including Anne King & Alan Seale of RCCMS.

- Challenge by those involved in Vocational is defining the role.
- Vocational is the Point of Difference for Rotary as a Community Organisation. [Editor refer last week's Bulletin for District Governors words on this fact]
- The strategy is shifting focus from a program management to resource support to other Avenues of Service
- The doing element will be the "Thought Leadership Series"

A great overview in 7 mins, that took 45min to present to RC Prahran, and is well supported by District Leadership Team.

### **Guest Speaker**

- Peter McTiernan, Director of Food Water Shelter ['FWS'] and Snr. Analyst at JB Were & Co



in his 'spare time'.

FWS is a NFP NGO that has been building and running eco-friendly children's villages in developing countries since 2005. Peter opened with special acknowledgement to Rotary support in particularly RC Bathurst NSW under which this program is auspiced. The work of FWS is done on the "Virtuous Circle" model through the avenues of:

- <u>Family</u>: Built on the "Attachment Theory" being care for by family. The "World's Best Mum" program where orphaned children who cannot say "I love my Mum" are placed into a family with a single mother and her children at the FWS home. The story of Gladness and her two children Rashidi and Miriam came to live at Kesho Leo where Deaf & Dumb boy Salim joined her family. There are now 9 Mothers and 29 children living in Kesho Leo.
- <u>Health</u>: Established a clinic now with 400 people attending annually
- Education: 80 x children at morning kindergarten and 40 x youngsters at afternoon

school

- Employment: 20 Local personnel now in the organisation
- <u>Industry</u>: locals participating in a Permaculture Design Course in farm production

FWS delivers the program through stages of Establishment, Knowledge Transfer, Income Building and Succession as a social incubator to enable the community to be self-sustained. Long term viability relies on funding with 84% currently through stable avenues of sponsors and grants. FWS is increasing the stability of funding through the "Mind the Gap" and Family Sponsorship initiatives

The presentation inspired many questions and Chairman Neil expressed appreciation with a presentation. Chairman Neil also fined himself on the first time ever being told he was speaking too softly.

President Roy closed the meeting inviting all to "LIGHT UP ROTARY"
