'Our Watch' has been established to drive nationwide change in the culture, behaviours and power imbalances that lead to violence against women and their children.

Our Watch's (previously the Foundation to Prevent Violence against Women and their Children) purpose is to raise awareness and engage the community in action to prevent violence against women and their children. They provide national leadership to prevent all forms of violence against women and their children.

Our Watch was conceived of and brought into existence in 2013 by the Commonwealth of Australia and the State of Victoria. The Northern Territory, South Australian, Tasmanian governments have also since become members of the organisation.

Our Watch's work derives from the government's commitment to the National Plan to Reduce Violence against Women and their Children 2010 – 2022 and gives expression to many of the activities in the Second Action Plan 2013–2016 – Moving Ahead.

CEO of Our Watch since November 2015, Mary joined the organisation from the National Heart Foundation of Australia, where she was CEO since 2014.

Mary is also the current President of Melbourne Rotary Club, being the third woman to head the Club. She joined Melbourne Rotary Club in 2006 and has served on the Board as a Director and then as a Vice President. Mary was a District Director for two years and headed up the Strategic Planning and Risk

GUEST SPEAKER - REPORT 15th MAY

Heather Ellis – Author. "Ubuntu and Beyond"

Heather spoke about her book "Ubuntu: One woman's Motorcycle Odyssey Across Africa," which is currently in its second print.

The decision to undertake this 15 month adventure was taken on a spur of the moment at a BBQ. It was a life changing experience and highlighted to her the universal human connection which bonds all of humanity. The adventure took place in 1995, before the internet was able to provide her with information – she only had a 4 year old 'dog-eared' book on travelling around the world on a motorbike and a Lonely Planet Book on Africa for guidance.

When Heather started the journey she had some fear but did not take a gun, only her smile. Her most scary moment was in Nairobi and there were other challenges however she was always confident that she would survive and embrace the journey. One of the big things she learnt from the journey was to trust her intuition, which she believed help guide her towards achieving her goals.

Heather felt that Africa was like one big village and one of the precautions she took was to always ask the permission of the Chief of each village before camping. During her journey she had many adventures, including climbing Mt Kilimanjaro and camping next to a lake, which reportedly had over 40,000 crocodiles in it.



After completing her journey she ended up in London and worked as a motorbike courier, before undertaking another adventure along the Silk Route.

It took 20 years to write the book. Heather has just finished her next book, on the Silk Route adventure.

At the end of her talk she added a twist and advised that she has HIV which was discovered after her Silk Route adventure, however that is another story.
