GARDEN DESIGNFEST PROCEEDS \$114,000 DISTRIBUTED

President Roy on February 18 shared the stage with triple Brownlow great Bob Skilton at the MCC Kew Sports Club on February 18.

The function was for presentation of cheques from the Garden DesignFest last November to charities selected by the Kew, Brighton North and Central Melbourne Sunrise clubs. The cheques totalled \$114,000. About 100 guests attended, including Boroondara Mayor Coral Ross.



Bob Skilton is Victorian Patron of Sporting Chance Cancer Foundation, our main beneficiary. It was formed by cancer specialist Dr Chris Hughes, cricket great Mark Taylor, rugby league legend Reg Gasnier, Olympian sprinter Raelene Boyle and Skilton.

Sporting Chance enables kids with cancer to get chemotherapy treatments at provincial hospitals without the huge disruption to the family of having to travel to major hospitals in the capitals. It also provides cancer research scholarships for doctors and scientists.

Rob Hines says, "The toll on families is otherwise horrendous – parents having to get leave from jobs, kids pulled out of school, finding city accommodation and so on. Sporting Chance helps take the chemo treatment to the kids in the country, with doctors and nurses trained in what to do and transport offered. Mark Taylor does commercial ads for Fujitsu and Fujitsu comes to the party by donating a small percent of every air-conditioner sale to Sporting Chance. All up the Foundation raises more than \$1m a year."

- Anna Nikitina and Sabbir Mamud, two interns being mentored by our club, commenced with RCCMS in January'15
- RCCMS has engaged with Mohammed Ebrafihi, Adviser to the Minister for Multicultural Affairs, concerning potential linkages with RCCMS youth programs
- George advised of the intent to put a resolution to the Board to sponsor the Model UN Assembly camp at Camp Getaway from 29-31 May.

Sergeant Bernie Gerlinger's theme for the morning fines was "Know Your Melbourne".

Guest Speaker:

The Hon Stephen Charles QC addressed the Club with the proposition that "Victoria's IBAC legislation Lacks Bite" Mr Charles compared Victoria's "IBAC" with the arguably successful ICAC created in NSW by the former Greiner Government. IBAC legislation appears at first glance to be based on the ICAC Act, containing powers in the investigation of corruption that are similar to ICAC's powers. However IBAC's brief is more limited, with a narrower definition of corrupt conduct. IBAC's jurisdiction is also further limited by s. 60(2) that requires it not to "conduct an investigation" - at all - unless it is reasonably satisfied that the conduct is "serious corrupt conduct".


