President George Mackey:

- Rotary Council legislation - matters in pipeline - move for Clubs to determine their own meetings format, timing, membership criteria - ending difference between e Clubs and normal Clubs.
- Our Club's proposed change of name to Rotary Central Melbourne goes back to Board this week.

Melbourne City Rotaract Club: Seven Women Fundraiser

- Rizwan Jaipurwala addressed the Club about this fundraiser and the screening of a documentary about the seven women (widowed or disabled) who helped women to get on with education, supporting own families etc - documentary screening 26 May/2 June.



"Better Life Mobile"

- Russell Barnes (Melbourne South Rotary) spoke about the not for profit social enterprise "Better Life Mobile".
- This is an organisation to provide better mobile plans supporting individuals and the community on a social enterprise basis. This stemmed from his contact with Big Issue and wanting to help low income earners and the homeless with mobile phone expense. There is a significant price advantage eg. a \$35.00 per month plan for unlimited calls, unlimited SM, unlimited voice mail and 4GB of data.
- They now have a contract arrangement with Telstra on a wholesale basis and provide their own call centre support. The aim is to provide more ethical plans with good pricing and no risk that customers will pay more.
- They have a low advertising budget. They have a promo code aiming to have Clubs sign up members or others with Telstra on an easy monthly plan. Clubs would receive \$1.00 per month per person. Rotary Club of Central Melbourne is the first Rotary Club approached (no doubt our Board will consider this).



Peter Duras - Community Service Team Report

- Peter gave his May Community Service Team report to the Club (this will be the last report this Rotary year).
- Most of Community's activities have centred around the central laneways alliance with youth projects in Hosier Lane. Principal winter needs are warm clothes, underwear and blankets. DIK provided 15 jumpers, 20 new jackets and some blankets. From Club members in particular Justine Murphy, they have sourced another 35 blankets. 23 selected hoodies were purchased for \$100.00 then washed and dried. Pacific Brands provided 600 pairs of underpants by donation. This exceeded youth projects requirements so 200 pairs were sorted and delivered to Shine for Kids and 200 pairs packed for Fitzroy Crossing. There is an ongoing need for blankets and quilts. Tess Hines anticipates more blankets through her quilting group.
- Youth Projects are just completing a renovation/new kitchen to use for life skills and vocational training purposes. Community Service has recommended to the Board that the Club allocate funds for this and for their art therapy program. Fed Square Men's Shed may also assist. Another anticipated program is for a lung function testing spirometer.
- Lentara - Allan Seale is pursuing the possibility of future mentoring.
- IFTAR dinner - it has been decided not to hold another IFTAR dinner during the current Rotary changeover period. Instead it is planned to have a breakfast event at the Club in 2016/2017.

- Sawbuck - the sawbuck has been delivered to Camp Getaway.
- Community Village Trailer: Elias Allan Seale and Neville Taylor are to examine ways to maximum its use with Neil Salvano.
- Peter also thanked his Community Service team for their great contributions in a busy year.

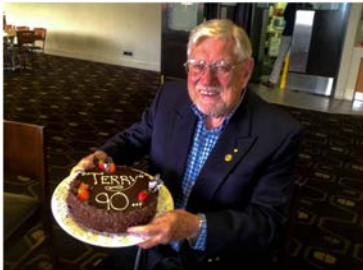
