GUEST SPEAKER PRESENTATION 22nd MAY - REPORT

Mary Barry, CEO 'Our Watch'; President RC of Melbourne

"A shared framework for the primary prevention of violence against women and their children in Australia."

Mary Barry is the CEO of 'Our Watch', a Victorian State Government agency established in 2013 to tackle the family violence problem. Mary outlined the ugly statistics about this social phenomena, including the death of a woman about every week somewhere in Australia, one in four Australian women experiencing violence at home usually by a known assailant, and so on. Mary pointed out that both genders experience violence but women are 3 times more likely to be killed by a partner than are men.

Our Watch is targeting the underlying drivers of disrespect and gender inequality in a culture change program that takes heart from the success long term programs regarding smoking, road trauma and skin cancer have had.

These were seen as insurmountable problems but substantial progress has been made in reducing smoking related deaths, road trauma and skin cancers through advocacy, publicity, education, etc. Mary talked about the stereotypical role models of masculinity that need to be challenged, the impact of violence on children who are too often witnesses to attacks at home, and the tendency in the media often to mischaracterize domestic violence as something else. So they are working in schools, workplaces, the media and sporting organizations.

Mary explained how individuals can make a difference by speaking up when they witness physical, verbal or psychological violence. It is really up to all of us.

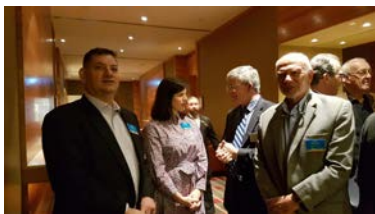
