KEN SEYFFER TURNS 101 YEARS OLD

Ken joined the Holyoke Rotary Club in 1975 and continues to be an Honorary Member. He received a Paul Harris Award in 1992-93 and the Dwight Award in 1999. Wayne Gass recently shared an article from Loomis where Ken was recently interviewed. Here is an excerpt from the article:

Ken Seyffer will turn 101 this spring, a still-lively man who has 15 great-grandchildren spread across the country. Ken lives with his 20-year-old cat.

His father was a sales manager for Ford Motors, overseeing 5,000 dealerships, and during his childhood the family moved eight times. He attended Colgate University, which is currently down to "a class of one," he added: himself.



He graduated in 1942 and immediately joined the infantry, fighting his way across Europe under General George Patton.

After the war, he joined Ford, becoming the owner of a dealership in Holyoke in 1949. Ten years later, he left the automobile business to enter banking. He joined the Shawmut Bank in Holyoke, eventually becoming senior vice president of the Shawmut Bank of South Hadley. He worked in banking for 25 years.

Ken has lived alone since his wife, Lolita, died six years ago. He still takes a drink a day, takes only one pill, reads three or four nonfiction books a month, watches news and sports on TV, and takes care of his ancient cat. He keeps up with public affairs and has an optimistic outlook on life.

Holyoke Rotary Club Contributes
\$30,000 towards Holyoke
"Playground
for All"



The Holyoke Rotary Club has pledged \$30,000 to the Miracle League of Western Massachusetts towards its efforts to construct a Playground for All welcoming everyone of different ages and abilities, not just children. This includes families with children and parents who have sensory-processing disorders, autism, and people of all ages in wheelchairs or other mobility devices. The Playground For All in Holyoke has been approved and will be at Kennedy Field on Lincoln Street. The playground will be designed to provide a multi-sensory play experience, to encourage all people to play, to allow greater accessibility, to ensure that people do not feel overwhelmed and to create a welcoming social environment. Total cost of the project is \$477,822.
