Good Works

End 68 Hours of Hunger

Puts nourishing food in the hands of school children to carry them through the weekend; a backpack includes 2 breakfasts, two lunches, 3 dinners & some additional snacks for a child. Children arrive in school Mondays ready to learn & performance improves. Currently 25 kids per week are receiving backpacks in York.

Provides support and service to older adults so that they can live with dignity in their own homes; rides to appointments, technology assistance, telephone reassurance, errands run. Started Jan 2021. Provides 2,000 rides per year on a modest \$20,000 yr budget.

York Community

Service Association

Food pantry, thrift store, family services including emergency funds for Town of York residents; dental, medical, medical equipment, car repair, utilities, rent, fuel, clothing, camp scholarships for children. Move people out of poverty from immediate need to address underlying reasons through holistic help. A comprehensive case management & advocacy program is offered through the Family Service Program.

Operating for 65 years, 75 families with children utilize the food pantry weekly, 300-350 people use some of the services each year. Food delivery possible. In addition to donated food from farmers & grocery stores, they depend on raising \$44,000 from individuals each year for the Food Pantry.

Teenagers & adults can volunteer for shifts in the Thrift Store. Clothing, housewares, games & toys, etc, can be donated, list of accepted items on website. Shopping in the Thrift Store supports organization & is open to all.

Younger children have used a birthday party as a food drive to collect items for the food pantry, but need to coordinate with YCSA on items.

Real estate would be accepted, as well as cars in running condition.

York County Family Fund

Bridging the gap for families in immediate crisis since its start in 2006, originally in collaboration with First Parish Church. Gathers funds to share with local churches, social services agencies, hospitals, & schools to help families to meet emergency needs & deal with crises through direct payments as pastor- & agency-approved; medical expenses, lost income due to medical issues, job loss, or an unexpected death, housing & utilities, auto repairs, school supplies, clothing, education, holiday meals, gifts. YCFF believes that the partner organizations are in touch with their communities and understand where the needs are. There is no requirement to be a member of any church; recipients retain anonymity. No overhead; every dollar given goes directly to recipients.

YCFF would welcome funds raised through children's birthday parties, lemonade stands or bake sales.

Center for Wildlife

Nestled at the base of Mount Agamenticus, Since 1986, has treated over 50,000 injured and orphaned wild animals and presented programming to thousands of community members annually to instill a sense of understanding, responsibility, and compassion for our natural world. Self-guided visits to facility, available for events. Collaborates with regional universities and the Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife to prepare for and address natural disasters and zoonotic diseases. Center for Wildlife's Wildlife Assistance Hotline also fields over 15,000 calls each year, providing guidance to callers from all over New England.

Volunteer advocacy and stewardship group for the Mount Agamenticus Conservation Program. The role of the Friends is to assist Program staff in carrying out educational, interpretive, community outreach and public use objectives without compromising the integrity of the region's sensitive ecological habitat. A Steering Committee, made up of state, local, and non-profit landowners, works to protect the region's water quality and wildlife habitat while managing sustainable recreational opportunities for the general public on over 10,000

contiguous acres.

Old York Historical Society

As one of the earliest English settlements in the country, York became the seat of government for the Province of Maine and thrived as a center of maritime commerce. The OYHS cares for 16 buildings, 20 properties, more than 20,000 artifacts, 50,000 archival objects in the library, and serves thousands of people annually through tours, educational programs, exhibitions,

and special events. Located in the heart of York at the corner of York St and Lindsay Rd, a complex of historical buildings is open to tour seasonally Memorial Day through October & includes the Old York Museum Center which has a gallery with some of the best objects from Southern Maine from the 1600s & 1700s. Jefferds Tavern, York Corner Schoolhouse, Perkins House Museum, George Marshal Store & Hancock Wharf. The Old Gaol is a National Historic Landmark sitting atop York's Gaol Hill, where colonial Maine's first prison was founded in 1656.

Offers educational school programs for children K-8, ranging in length from 90 minutes to four hours in hands-on lessons and activities that are rich in local traditions. Children's Summer Program, Stories in the Old Schoolhouse. All York 5th graders participate in 2-day immersion program, 'Living History'. Adult volunteers are welcome for this program & will be trained.

Walking tours include the story of colonial York, York's wartime service, & cemetery walk.

The York Public Library Association

The York Public Library Association Incorporated in 1922, a literal and figurative community center in the heart of York Village, free library cards to workers in York as well as York residents, serves 13,000 residents and 30,000 visitors, averages 5000-8000 people served each month. Lectures, free wifi, Hoopla downloadable ebooks & magazines, technology help, oral history recording, family history research, digitization of photos, place for teens after school, community meeting rooms for groups as well as Town boards to meet, children's area, weekly walking group.

White Pine Programs

Runs a variety of nature connection and environmental education programming; a Forest School (ages 4 – 15) for the full school year two days per week, weekend forest program for ages 7 – 15, 6 weeks of summer camp, multiple teen expeditions and short weekends throughout the year, after school Nature Clubs in 3 communities – York, Kittery, and Portsmouth, hosts community programs for adults and families, and pre-school playgroups in partnership with land trusts and recreation centers, professional development programs for educators in public schools. Mission to provide transformational nature experiences that forge personal resilience, inspire lifelong commitment to our environment, & connect individuals to community. Operating since 1999, serving 3000 people each year, annually depends on \$135,000 support from individuals.

Currently welcoming: donations of land, transport vans, bark mulch, recycled asphalt & labor to spread, & people with finance and legal backgrounds interested in joining board or committees.

Health Care

York Hospital

A staple in the community since 1906, main York campus saw 12,738 total acute patient days and 3,453 total acute admissions, provided over \$1 million in free care to community members, & offers meal & prescription delivery services, free transportation to and from medical appointments, and a House Calls program to provide medical care to older adults who are unable to leave their homes due to physical or mental decline.

Many opportunities to volunteer for all ages: Greeters/information, Newspaper delivery, Patient Rounders, transportation, Clerical Services, Physician's offices, assist clinical teams with support services and errands, Special Events & Fundraising, Patient Advisors, Reiki Services, Pastoral Care

Local schools and community groups are encouraged to conduct fundraising activities/events to benefit York Hospital, or to promote awareness of disease prevention & management and healthy living programs. Families with children can also get involved by helping to plan and organize fundraising activities like lemonade stands, bake sales, yard sales, golf tournaments, sporting events, proceeds from community runs/walks. Cars, art, real estate, bitcoin are accepted.

First Saturday of June is the York Hospital 5K Road Race open to all ages; many families participate – sometimes three generations race together.

In late-July to mid-August, fundraising dinner or a cruise called the Hancock Classic to raise funds for the Hancock Family Fund for Healthy Aging.

On Labor Day, the hospital's Living Well With Cancer Fund is often the recipient of proceeds from The Big Andrew Surf Competition (<https://www.thebigandrew.org/new-index>), a fun, local surfing event held on Long Sands Beach for over a decade.

For adults 50 years of age and older, 36 Main St, York Beach. Operated by Town of York Parks & Recreation, offers opportunities to socialize, learn, recreate and be well. From book club, to line dancing, to "Rolling Out of York" field trips, and nature walks, to in-house performing arts presentations. York residents are given priority for programs. Non-residents can access seasonally with \$25 annual user fee. Drop-in Café with coffee/tea/hot chocolate and muffins free of charge weekdays. Delivered meals, buckets of sand delivered for walkways. Pick-up home-cooked lunches and dine-in meals.

York Housing

Since 1978, has provided affordable rental housing for seniors and workers in York in a range of affordability options: Yorkshire Commons, Village Woods, Pine Grove, Deerfield Pl, Carriage House Aptmts, Baldwin Aptmts, Moorehouse Place (now leasing up for York workers).

Their 136 units in senior communities offer independent living, complete with a menu of services, thoughtfully planned for older active adults who deserve

the peace of mind that comes with community living. Also helps other York seniors with home repairs for health & safety including smoke detectors. Partners with Heart to Heart for transportation needs, grocery shopping help, home care of their residents and York seniors.

Appreciates contributions to their Wishing Well Fund for tenant services not paid for by HUD funds, like meal programs & activities.
