

Aussie Tag Along Tour – e-club news

This week we have had an incredible announcement from the Aussie Tag Along Tour conducted by the E-Club. As all Clubs are aware the E-Club and in particular PDG Heather and PDG Ian from time to time conduct and direct tag-along caravan tours for the purpose of raising funds and enriching the Rotary experience. Earlier this year they conducted a 10-island extravaganza Tag Along Tour of Tassie working in conjunction with District Governor John Dare of District 9830. This week the Tour Director announced a donation of the profits of just over \$33,000 raised during the tour from individual members, Clubs and the tour itself to Australian Rotary Health to establish a PHD Research Scholarship over three years. The tour will provide funding of \$11,000 for each of the three years, Australian Rotary Health will contribute \$7,000 each year and the relevant University will contribute a further \$11,000. This is a fantastic achievement from the E-Club. Congratulations to all Club members and to PDG Ian and Heather. Congratulations also to those who joined the tour, Rotarian and non-Rotarian alike and to the Rotary Clubs of District 9830 who supported the tour every inch of the way.


