Rotary "Raising the Spirits" Trip to Charleville, March 24-31

Colleagues we will be undertaking a second "Raising the Spirits" trip in conjunction with Outback Links to Charleville in March. We are intending to return to Charleville to assist those drought-affected families that we were unable to assist in September because of floods.

Although there has been rainfall in some areas around Charleville, many areas are still in severe drought. The rural community gratefully received our visit in September and Rotary 9640 received national publicity about our last trip. I found it to be a most rewarding Rotary "working bee".

Rotarian John McKenny from Glen Innes Rotary has volunteered to return to Charleville as leader of our next "Raising the Spirits" trip. He has just returned from Charleville, scoping tasks to be undertaken on properties and is now calling for volunteers to assist him.

We are looking for volunteers with the following skills: plumbing, carpentry, electrical repairs, painting and general handypersons. There will be plenty of work for all and we propose to complete the internal painting of the Historic House museum in Charleville.

As per our last visit, Rotarians will be expected to provide their own transport to and from Charleville as well as their own accommodation. We will provide fuel and food for those travelling to properties outside Charleville. All items for repairs to properties will be purchased from suppliers in Charleville. There will be a welcome barbeque on Saturday March 25.
