Rotary Basics



RI's involvement in Rotary Club of Grenada in the advancement of Rotary worldwide

(Excerpts from PDG John Watts' presentation on the occasion of 43 years of Rotary service to the Grenadian Community)

- Polio immunization was one of the greatest projects undertaken by RI, and the Rotary Club
 of Grenada was instrumental in the eradication of polio from Grenada.
- In 1972 RI organized all of the non-district clubs in the Caribbean and Bahamas into four groups; L,M,N,O. Group O was comprised of St. Vincent, St. Lucia, Trinidad, Grenada and Guyana. An Administrative Advisor was appointed for the groups. Group O was led by John Watts.
- In 1973 there was a change in the Administrative Advisors, however, Group O remained unchanged with John Watts at the helm.
- In 1974 RI created District 404 consisting of 45 clubs. Through mail ballot, all clubs voted and Grenada's John Watts was elected as the first District Governor.
- The Rotary Club of Grenada hosted over 27 GSE programs and participated in over 25.
- In 1992 a representative from the Rotary Club of Grenada, PP Henry Joseph, was elected to lead a GSE team to New Zealand.
- In 1991 the RI president invited PDG John Watts to be his special representative at a District conference in Phoenix Arizona.



RI President's monthly message

My dear brothers and sisters in Rotary!



We have a color for the 2011-12 Rotary year, and that color is green. Why green? Because green is the color of spring, of new life, of bright leaves bursting forth from spreading branches. And there is no doubt that it is time to "green" Rotary – to lift our deepening pallor of gray and replace it with brighter shades of green.

Overall, in Rotary, only 11 percent of our members are under the age of 40, while 68 percent are over 50 and 39 percent are over 60. It's not too hard to see where this will lead us in 10, 20, and 30 years down the line, if we don't do something about it now. It is not enough to simply bring in new members. We need to bring in younger members, who will breathe new life and new vigor into our organization.

How can we be more attractive to younger members, who are so different in so many ways from the young professionals of a generation or two ago? We have to come to them where they are – and for most young people, where they are is on the Internet, on Facebook, on Twitter and e-mail, and on their smartphones. A club that doesn't have a presence on the Internet simply doesn't exist as far as they are concerned. A club's website is its public face – and it has to be a good one.

More than anything, I believe we need to bring back the idea of the family of Rotary. We need to look at all of Rotary as one family: Rotarians, their families, and also Rotaractors, Interactors, Youth Exchange students and alumni, Foundation alumni, and so on. And we need to consider retention as an idea that applies not just to Rotarians, but to the entire family of Rotary.

Too often, we look outward to find new members, and we do not see our own young generation, waiting to be called upon. We must look to them to find the capable and enthusiastic new members who will be the club presidents, the district governors, and the RI senior leaders of tomorrow.

We owe it to our Rotary family – past, present, and future – to make sure that our generation of Rotarians is not the last. We must, in a very real sense, reach within – to embrace our Rotary family, so that we can better embrace all of humanity.

Rotary International News

- <u>The Rotarian</u> magazine won seven awards, including a gold award for general excellence for the August, September, and October 2010 issues. Other honors included a gold award for the cover illustration of the April 2010 issue; a gold award for the magazine's media kit; a silver award for "On the Money," an April 2010 management column; a bronze award for design excellence for the September and October 2010 issues; a bronze award for <u>The Rotarian's Greater Goods Catalog</u>, a brochure originally published in the December 2010 issue; and a bronze award for the feature "How many fifth graders know someone on meth?" in the August 2010 issue.
- The Rotary Foundation Trustees announced strategic partnerships with Oikocredit, to support microcredit loans for entrepreneurs, and Aga Khan University, to support training nurses and midwives. Strategic partnerships are a key part of the Foundation's Future Vision Plan.
- The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees has selected Uppsala University in Uppsala, Sweden, to host a new Rotary Peace Center.
- The Water and Sanitation Rotarian Action Group is teaming up with Africare to bring 5 million gallons of clean water to 30 schools in Malawi and Tanzania.


