

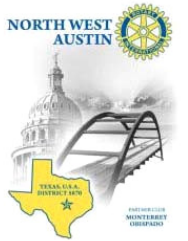

Adam DeBower, Founder-Austin Beerworks

In 2011, Adam and four co-founders started Austin Beerworks. Back then, they thought the brewery would be considered a success if they could produce around 5,000 31-gallon barrels a year. This year, ABW will produce and self-distribute ~22,000 barrels, which is nearly 7.4 million pints of beer.

Adam is also the Board Vice-Chair of the Texas Craft Brewers Guild, advocating fixes to antiquated beer regulations that inhibit and cap how much growth is possible for Texas craft breweries. One of the fastest growing segments of our economy, the Craft Brewing Industry Contributed \$67.8 Billion to the U.S. economy and more than 456,000 Jobs in 2016.
