Jerry Johnson Trust Matching Program Update #6

Just a short update this week: 9 new donors over the past 7 days and \$3,240 in contributions. To date, 117 Rotarians representing 30 clubs have contributed a total of \$49,483! All but 8 of the 117 contributors have reached a new Paul Harris Fellow level as the result of their participation.

Update: There was no change in the leader board this week. The Rotary Club of Austin remains in the lead (\$6,900) with Pflugerville close behind in 2nd place (\$6,235). Waco is in 3rd Place (\$3,275), and Lakeway/Lake Travis is now in 4th Place (\$2,995). Please remember that the winner of this race will receive 1,000 Foundation Recognition Points to distribute as they see fit.

The match will continue until we run out of points. As of today, a little under 60% of the match pool has been used, and we continue to estimate that the pool will be used up sometime in mid-to-late October.

As a refresher, District 5870 is offering the following to any Rotarian who is already a Paul Harris Fellow but not yet a Paul Harris Fellow +8. Using a pool of Foundation Recognition Points, we will match contributions of new cash made to the Annual Fund-SHARE during Rotary Year 2019-20 on a 1-to-1 basis in amounts of \$250 to \$500 for any active Rotarian in District 5870 who is not yet a Paul Harris Fellow +8

Please note: These matches are limited to one per donor and will be processed on a first come, first served basis.

The Marshall Plan

German Chancellor Angela Merkel reiterated the power of international cooperation for creating "win-win situations." Speaking in Berlin at an event hosted by The German Marshall Fund of the United States (GMF) celebrating the 70th anniversary of the Marshall Plan, Chancellor Merkel underscored, "The Marshall Plan showed how politics is to be understood with common convictions and values, and how it can work for all. When we stand up for shared values, we have peace and prosperity."

The Marshall Plan was an audacious, innovative strategy to tackle the most pressing challenges of its time. Breaking Western Europe's cycle of conflict and rebuilding economies devastated by World War II was an immense task, and the Marshall Plan is a concrete example of the scale of change made possible by bold thinking and international cooperation.

The spirit of the Marshall Plan is as needed now as it was over 70 ago. The values that the Marshall Plan represents and that GMF is dedicated to promoting - democracy, free enterprise, universal respect for all – are as essential in addressing today's challenges as they were in 1947. The Marshall Plan still serves as a source of hope because it demonstrated that with shared purpose we can overcome seemingly insurmountable problems.

Initiated in June of 1947 by then-U.S. Secretary of State George Marshall, the Marshall Plan was integral to reconciling Germany with the rest of Europe, rebuilding European economies after the devastation of World War II, and establishing the institutions that have underpinned transatlantic security and prosperity for the past 70 years.

Established on the 25th anniversary of the Marshall Plan with a gift from the German government, GMF has strengthened transatlantic cooperation in the spirit of the Marshall Plan for the last 45 years. Chancellor Merkel celebrated GMF's work saying, "For Germany, GMF helps to understand the American spirit. And, GMF helps Americans understand our country." She continued, "For more than 45 years, GMF has served as a transatlantic exchange, building mutual understanding, providing information, clarifying positions, and identifying commonalties."
