BASTROP STATE PARK Fire Recovery Workdays

As part of Service Austin, the Bastrop Rotary Club is sponsoring two workdays in Bastrop State Park - one Nov. 18th and one Nov 19th. Volunteers, under the supervision of Park Staff will be performing several tasks each day. One task will be cleanup of camp grounds and public areas that have been damaged by the fire. A second task will be spreading mulch to help save the endangered Houston Toad whose habitat has been damaged by the fire. The park can accommodate 50 volunteers each day. PolioPlus

The total is now in for all Rotarians who contributed to PolioPlus during the week of October 18-24. RI reports as follows:

- Rotarians generously made online contributions of more than US\$2.6 million to The Challenge during the week of 18-24 October, in observance of World Polio Day on 24 October. The Rotary Foundation offered double Paul Harris Fellow recognition for online contributions of \$100 or more.
- Contributions were received from Rotarians in 105 countries; the top five giving countries were the United States, Brazil, Canada, Mexico, and the Philippines.
- In addition, RI reports the good news regarding our \$200 million Challenge, that as of Nov. 11 we have US \$195.2 million!!!
- And more: Polio data so far in 2011 show report Afghanistan 47 cases, India 1, Nigeria 42, Pakistan 136. Non-endemic countries 276. Total worldwide cases are 502. Year to date in 2010 was 767. We are winning the battle--we are this close!
