



VETERANS DAY

A TIME FOR REMEMBERING - - A TIME FOR DEDICATION Submitted by David Davis

Veterans Day is November 11. The day was originally set aside to honor and recognize those lost in WWI. In the June of 1954, Congress formally replaced Armistice Day with Veterans Day.

THE HUGS PROJECT OF AUSTIN at OHUMC is a group of women at Oak Hill, including several ladies who are not members of the church, who have been active on a weekly basis for over five (5) years preparing and shipping boxes of neck coolers and various personal items to our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan. On this 2012 Veterans day, the women of the Oak Hill HUGS PROJECT feel that it is fitting that we pause from our routines to remember and honor those who have served and, in particular, those who were lost in military service to our country. And then to rededicate ourselves to the task - - each in our own way - - of liberty and justice for which they gave their sacrifice.

CONSIDER: As you go through this day and this week, bear in mind: WWI (116,516 killed); WWII (405,389 killed and 670,000 wounded); Korea (36,572 killed); Vietnam (52,220 killed; 8.7 million served); Persian Gulf (383 killed). Iraq and Afghanistan (to date, 6604 killed; 85% or more were under 30; 70% were under 25; 144 were women). [Source: DOD Defense Casualty Analysis System; For Iraq / Afghanistan, Washington Post - "FACES OF THE FALLEN"]

LEGACY. The battle of Gettysburg was fought over several days in rural Pennsylvania around July 1, 1863. A few months later on November 19, 1863, President Lincoln gave an address at the consecration of the National Cemetery on the Gettysburg battlefield with what he called a "few appropriate remarks". The cemetery, the President stated, was the final resting place for those who had given their lives so that the nation might live. And in the words which are carved in the Lincoln memorial in Washington, the President concluded by saying that we as the persons who are living and remembering can not hallow the sacrifices made, but rather the challenge is for us - - the living and the ones who remember - - to be rededicated and to "resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain".

ACTION. The Hugs Project of Austin hopes that on this Veterans Day - - 2012 - - we can all stop, reflect, and then take action to express in concrete ways to veterans of all ages and all services our appreciation for their service, their sacrifices, and their giving to our country.
