Note from our District Governor

This month's Rotary Theme is The Family and, as my wife Brigitte is recuperating from a serious health situation, that topic is most important to me. Many of you have heard that she recently suffered a brain aneurysm. My thanks to you, my Rotary family, for your thoughts, messages, words of encouragement, and kindnesses.

Brigitte complained of a severe headache on Sunday, October 30th, at about 7:00 PM. It looked really bad and I immediately called an ambulance. She went through an emergency brain surgery later that night. The surgery was successful. She spent two days in ICU, two days in IMC (Intermediate Care) and has been out of IMC since then. She was released from Seton Hospital on the 9th of November and checked in to a rehabilitation hospital.

She has been recovering well and has been going through physical, occupational and speech therapies. We are expecting a complete recovery. Again, thanks. Let's all celebrate this season with special emphasis on the family.

ROTARY'S ENTRY IN THE ROSEBOWL PARADE WILL BE... Inching Towards The End of Polio

The Rose Parade is viewed by an estimated 300 million TV viewers worldwide and is a great opportunity to display the great work of Rotary. It is constructed with donations from Rotarians worldwide. Last year, my family was among the 800 volunteers who had the opportunity to help prepare the Rotary Float for the Parade. This is the 25Th Anniversary of NWAR's Partnership with the Bluebonnet Trails MHMR Center

Today, the NW Austin Rotary Club will host 60 guests from the Bluebonnet Trails Day Hab program for a Christmas breakfast at Balcones Country Club. This is the 25th year the party has been held. In addition to a breakfast buffet, the Bethany United Methodist church bell choir will play favorite Christmas musical selections and Santa will arrive to give gifts to and be photographed with each participant.

The Day Hab program, which serves adults with intellectual developmental disabilities in Williamson County, is located at the Bluebonnet Trails Community Services center in Round Rock. Participants have a variety of activities to stimulate their abilities and to enhance life skills. Each year the staff says that this party is the highlight of the year for the participants and is an opportunity for them to practice social skills they have learned.

This partnership started in 1986 when the NW Austin Rotarians adopted the Hill Country Workshop as their local community service project. Initially Rotarians painted and fixed up the facilities as well as taking individuals to Special Olympics events and occasionally lending a hand with a major recycling contract. One Rotarian's business employed an individual through the Assisted Employment program. In 1997 the Hill Country Workshop was consolidated with other programs into the Bluebonnet Trails Community Services center. By that time the contract work had been phased out and replaced by the Day Hab program that serves these individuals with training and life enrichment programs.

In addition to Williamson County, Bluebonnet Trails serves 7 other central Texas counties. It offers an array of mental health and intellectual developmental disabilities services to children, adolescents and adults. Services to infants (ages 0-3) with developmental delays or a medical condition that might cause developmental delays are provided through Bluebonnet Trails' early childhood intervention program (ECI). This year the NW Austin Rotary club provided a \$4000 grant which was matched by the City of Georgetown for equipment which can be temporarily loaned to families to help resolve mobility problems and to overcome special developmental issues. There are many other programs that help individuals with drug and alcohol abuse, autism, crisis intervention for behavioral health issues, and disaster trauma support following events like the Bastrop fires, hurricanes Katrina and Rita, and Marble Falls flooding.
