TRF Sets up Disaster Fund for Japan

In response to the massive earthquake and tsunami that struck Japan on 11 March, The Rotary Foundation has established the Rotary Japan 2011 Disaster Recovery Fund, which will support long-term recovery projects in affected areas. Rotarians and non-Rotarians can donate online. Clubs and districts can contribute cash and District Designated Fund (DDF) allocations to the fund.

Group Study Exchange Team Safe

Rotarian Robert Blackburn was leading a Group Study Exchange team in Japan when the earthquake struck. The five team members from Illinois, USA, were in a hotel in Tokyo, getting ready for a farewell dinner with their hosts. Blackburn says the earthquake lasted at least two minutes. He used a laundry cart outside his hotel room for protection. After the tremors stopped, he walked 18 floors down to the lobby, where the rest of the team congregated.

Former Speaker Honored

Former Northwest Austin Rotary speaker, David Oshinsky, Ph.D., the Blanton Chair in History and Distinguished Teaching Professor at the University of Texas Austin has been honored by The Columbia University Medical Center for his 2006 Pulitzer Prize winning book Polio: An American Story. Professor Oshinsky spoke to the club about his book which chronicled America's efforts to eradicate polio in the United States, focusing on the March of Dimes. He included in his book a chapter discussing Rotary's world-wide efforts to

eliminate polio from the remainder of the world. Columbia presented him the Cartwright Prize, an award established in the 1870s by Benjamin A. Cartwright to create a prestigious lecture series for the exchange of scientific knowledge. Dr. Oshinsky's lecture was entitled: "Polio: A Look Back at America's Most Successful Public Health Crusade." In 2009 he was awarded the Dean's Medal for Distinguished Contribution to Public Health by the Bloomberg School of Public Health at Johns Hopkins University for his historical work related to polio. Dr.



Oshinsky now serves on an advisory committee with Bill Gates related to the Gates Foundation grants to the Rotary International effort Polio Plus. He has graciously agreed to a return "engagement" at North West Austin Rotary in Spring, 2012, to update our club with a first-hand report on our efforts to defeat polio.
