Rotary Gun Policy Proposed

District Governor Bruce Golden has contacted all club Presidents about a change in the rotary gun policy proposed by Rotary International. The proposed policy change is to go into effect on July 1, 2017. Concern has been expressed by the District 5870 team and by club members in the district and nationwide. DG Bruce has stated, "By now I am sure you have heard about RI's new gun policy. We had guite an uproar the day the NRA published the article. I just want each of you to know that, as your District Governor, I hear your frustration and share your concerns. My team and I have already begun conversations with other District and Zone leadership and with Rotary International in an effort to persuade them to reconsider and/or rescind their policy directive and language before it goes into effect on July 1, 2017. Some members are threatening to guit, some are refusing to support TRF in anyway, many are asking for clarification. I have been forwarding all inquiries to Greg Podd (our zone director)."

The new gun policy is summarized in the FAQs:

What Does This Decision Cover? The policy only address these elements:

- Rotary clubs/districts are not to conduct guns shows or transfer ownership of weapons;
- 2) Rotary clubs/districts and their events cannot be sponsored by weapons companies;
- 3) The Rotary name and logo are not to be used in combination with the name or logo of an entity that primarily manufactures, or is the primary business of selling weapons;
- 4) The Rotary name and logo are not to be used on weapons.

What Areas Does This Decision Not Cover?

- 1) This decision does not limit anyone's right to own or use weapons of any kind. Nor does it make any commentary on the use of weapons.
- 2) This policy still does not restrict any club from using guns in sporting events (e.g., turkey shoots, fox hunts, skeet shoots, etc.)

There are concerns that this change is putting RI into the political realm of taking a stand on gun control while Rotary has always attempted to not be a political organization. Additional concerns are this may be a first step in Rotary taking a stand on other controversial political issues, the policy targets any entity whose primary business is the sale or manufacture of guns, weapons or other armaments, and may have an adverse effect on local club programs, events and fund raisers.

This issue was discussed at our Board meeting last Friday and it was concluded the best course of action was to request input from all concerned members. The board will follow the wishes of the majority of responses. So I can communicate our wishes to the District Governor, please carefully consider this and provide your answer by email to kevin@silverstarcapitalgroup.com.
