End Polio Now -- Make History Today

An announcement at the Rotary International Convention in Lisbon, Portugal, set the stage for a bold new chapter in the partnership between Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation in the campaign for polio eradication. "Going forward, the Gates Foundation will match two-to-one, up to US\$35 million per year, every dollar Rotary commits to reduce the funding shortfall for polio eradication through 2018," said Jeff Raikes, the foundation's chief executive officer, in a prerecorded video address shown during the convention's plenary session on 25 June. "If fully realized, the value of this new partnership with Rotary is more than \$500 million. In this way, your contributions to polio will work twice as hard." The joint effort, called End Polio Now - Make History Today, comes during a critical phase for the Global Polio Fradication Initiative.

Notes From Kim Krahn on South Fork Fires

June 29 - We had an afternoon thunderstorm....finally, yesterday that brought some relief from the smoke but the fire has burned over 91,000 acres of the Rio Grande National Forest so far and has only 2% containment. I've been feeding the fire fighters, national guard and law enforcement free since Tuesday. I'm only feeding up to 100 per day since that's all that's stationed behind me at the fire station. There are 1400 fire fighters in all working the fires. The Red Cross and Salvation Army have been feeding the others that are housed in locations closer to the current firefight. The fire fighters and forest service said they've never seen a fire like this one. The bark beetle has caused major damage in this forest and that combined with draught, dry thunderstorms and high winds have become the perfect storm for fire. I have heard from the AG in Durango. He's getting with other clubs up here to see what the businesses need. Only one other restaurant donated a meal and I'm the only one that's done 2 meals a day and multiple days. I'm hoping for enough support from fellow Rotarians to feed the responders stationed behind me as long as they are here. The outpouring of gratitude has been inspiring and even if I have to absorb the cost myself well worth it! Thank you for considering this request!! I miss the club every Friday and still brag about all you do.

July 1 - Thank you so much for your support. We/they can't tell you how much the support of others means to them. They've been working long hours in bad conditions. Needless to say there was a very somber mood at the fire station behind my malt shoppe today. Last night's news was devastating! Our hearts and prayers go out to those in AZ who lost their lives fighting another wildfire. The entire Rio Grande forest is currently closed and efforts to protect and save the Rio Grande reservoir are ongoing and difficult. The reservoir is of course the headwaters of the Rio Grande river that flows into TX along the border. I don't know what to say because thank you doesn't seem enough! God

July 5 - We are having a fundraiser tomorrow night and I will let them know about Rotary's kind and generous support! Fires continue to burn in the back country with 2 of the largest headed towards each other. Still have crews from all over the west here fighting it...keeping people and structures safe. Please extend an invitation to club members to come visit and stay with us when we're not on fire. It's still incredibly beautiful! Chuck and Jane Durant came through here summer before last and Steve Windle visits occasionally as he and Gayle have a house in Durango, just 99 miles to the west. Thank everyone again for their support. I have the 4way test hanging in my Malt Shoppe and tell my employees that's how we do things.

July 20 - Received the check and donated to the South Fork Fire Department. Attached is photo of donation being received by Jonathan Gilbert, head of EMS for our fire dept. They were very grateful and surprised that a Rotary club so far away would be so generous. They assumed many of our members were frequent visitors to this area. Told them that to my knowledge only Steve Windle and Chuck and Jane Durant had been here, but that NWAR club is made up of some very special and generous people. I hope to visit this fall after we close the Malt Shoppe for the season and bring photos of the unprecedented event we just went through an thank the club members in person. Thank you again for the club members' and board's generosity! Best wishes, Kim
