Typical International Service Committee responsibilities from the Rotaract Handbook include:

- Reviews members' suggestions for international service projects to ensure they address real needs and can be successfully carried out by
- Develops plans for the club's annual international service project
- Leads, organizes, and implements the international service project
- Develops additional activities that promote international understanding among club members and in the community

CONDUCTING SERVICE PROJECTS

Rotary committees are responsible for planning and carrying out successful service projects that utilize funds and club members' time to benefit those in need. For each project, develop a timeline, establish criteria for measuring progress, and consider the resources and tools available to support you. What follows is the standard process for planning and implementing a Rotary service project.

- 1. Assess the situation.
- 2. Choose a project.
- 3. Make a plan.
- 4. Carry out your project.
- 5. Evaluate your project.

ROTARY'S SERVICE PRIORITIES

When planning your projects, choose a community need that falls within Rotary's service priorities:

- Areas of focus
- Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development
- Avenues of Service: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, International Service, Youth Service

Strengthen your projects by collaborating with members who have expertise in a particular area of service, other Rotary clubs, other organizations, and the community being served. Find partners by:

- Contacting your district Rotary Foundation committee chair or district programs committee chair
- Networking with other Rotary members at district and international
- Browsing or posting on Rotary Ideas and Rotary Showcase
- Expanding your international connections through fellowship visits with other clubs and through Rotary Friendship Exchange
- Connecting with fellow Rotarians on social networking sites
- Exploring the Lifecycle of a Project section of Rotary.org
