


ROTARY DISTRICT 7030 NEWS

ROTARY END PERIOD POVERTY PROJECT

The generous donation from the Montero Medical Missions has given over 5,000 sanitary items including sanitary towels, tampons and cups that are being distributed to young girls in Saint Lucia.



The End Period Poverty Project is a joint collaboration between the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia and the Rotary Club of Gros Islet aimed at addressing and eradicating period poverty, which refers to the lack of access to menstrual hygiene products, education, and proper sanitation facilities.

The project focuses on raising awareness about the issue, advocating for policy changes, providing menstrual products to those in need, and promoting education about menstrual health and hygiene. It aims to ensure that menstruating individuals have access to the resources and support they need to manage their periods with dignity and without financial hardship.






