This workshop for young men at risk is scheduled for May 7-10, 2013.

The event is the brain child of Mrs. Fortuna Anthony a former Chief Education Officer, now retired and still very much involved in matters relating to the education of Saint Lucia's youth. As a "pilot project" the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia has agreed to finance the 1. of possibly 4 such workshops in the amount of app. \$5,000.00 with all expenses to be accounted for in detail.

The official opening ceremony was exceptionally well attended with 4 Ministers of Government and several Principals and Education Officials in attendance. Ministers Reynolds, Dalson, J.
