New President of the Rotary Club Rudolph "Doddy" Francis is installed



During the handing over ceremony held at Jack's Fine Dining in Rodney Bay outgoing Pres. Konrad thanked his board and presented each member with a small token of his appreciation for their support during the Rotary year 2012 –13.

To save time on a long President's report a written synopsis of the year gone by was prepared and available for Rotarians and guest to read.

The occasion was used to bestow a Paul Harris Fellowship on Dr. Stephen King



With this prestigious award we honour, in recognition of the outstanding work he has done, and continues to do, in several areas consistent with the projects and activities of the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia.

Dr. King has always had a strong interest in Violence Prevention and Youth Development. Of course this has been illustrated time and time again by his very vocal advocacy on these topics and his personal activities in the community. He has also been extremely active through education and awareness programs on Sexually Transmitted Diseases and HIV/Aids, through his publications in newspaper and magazines, presence in the mass media and most importantly his one on one interactions with young people in Saint Lucia and through youth groups such as RISE where he was a founding member in 2007 and continues to volunteer his time extensively. The Awarded is a past member of our club who had to leave to focus on his national role as

Chief Medical Officer, however even after leaving the club he pushed hard over a number of

years to attempt to bring the Rotary Mobile Youth Counseling Clinic to fruition. As a result of the leadership and drive of Dr. Stephen King, the Rotary Bus as it is called, is providing a mechanism to reach thousands of young people throughout the length and breadth of Saint Lucia and bringing the messages of "healthy lifestyles", "HIV Aids Prevention", "violence prevention", and "hope for a better future".

Perhaps the greatest gift that Dr. Stephen King possesses is his natural ability to relate to, and be understood by the youth of Saint Lucia. He is able to get them to understand why they should change their behavior positively to improve their personal prospects and also contribute to nation building.

The Rotary Club of Saint Lucia therefore recognizes Dr. Stephen King by conferring on him the Paul Harris Fellowship Award, for his extensive service to the community. We do this as an encouragement for him to continue his important work in the interest of creating better lives for the young people of Saint Lucia.

Soup kitchen – one already exists in Castries. 200 – 400 individuals fed daily. **Resource Center** – to be explored further.

Other 'explorables' – BTC; RISE; Family Court; Uptown Girls Home and BTC (Boy's Training Centre) Doctors in Action – To be re-introduced and spearheaded by PP Azmina, assisted by PP Joe.

Tree Planting Project

- a) Will continue next school year with schools that have requested additional trees.
- b) On December 13, 2013, ARC will participate in (re)planting trees on several acres of Bellevue's hillside

Community Service Youth Project - PP Frank commented on the importance to undertake such project properly and was appointed committee chair person for it.

Youth Camp Dir. David will report further at a future meeting

First Move Chess IPP Konrad has agreed to continue spearheading this initiative.

Fire Victim EC\$1,000 donation still committed project. - meanwhile completed.

currently being made.
