
#### THE WHITE HOUSE HONORS ROTARY WOMEN FOR THEIR HUMANITARIAN SERVICE

#### **Pres. Chester's comments**

He talked about the poverty reduction project so very dear to him.

The initial aim was to raise an amount of EC \$5,000.00 for the project from individual members and ask the club to match what was raised. He was pleased to advise all present that on the night of the fellowship at Rotarian Phillip's house an amount of \$1,320.00 was donated. As of today we have raised from members \$5,732.00. A generous Rotarian decided to bring the figure up to \$6,000.00 which is the amount we now have. The board had already approved to match this amount from charity funds.

It is our intention to take to the streets one night to distribute a hot meal, a blanket and a toiletries to the needy as a starter to our program. We also hope to increase the frequency of providing a decent meal to the poor to more than just at Christmas.

P.P Malcolm Charles has provided invaluable support and has finally been able to have the Minister of Social Transformation address our club on October 17th as to the Government's plan in dealing with the subject at hand and to give us a better understanding of the gravity of the problem. We hope to partner with the ministry in identifying the priority needs and come up with a plan of action thereafter.

#### Update on the Micoud Secondary School library project

Our assistance is timelier than ever. Only last week the Spoke Editor received these pictures from the school showing the existing "LRC" Learning Resource Centre. Little did we know it would be the last photos taken the LRC.



The pictures were to illustrate the confined space students had to study.

Well even that small room is now no longer. A fire, most likely caused by an electrical fault has on Saturday October 11, 2014 destroyed the room. Only the quick action of some students, at the school at that time calling the fire service prevented the fire from spreading and endangering the rest of the school. This only means that our project is ever so urgent.



According to Pres. Chester: God works in mysterious ways and everything in life happens for a reason. We are called to provide service above self and to help who we can, when we can We must now do what ever is humanly possible to ensure this project to completion. Those kids need the project and both the project and the kids need us. Let's get to work team and thanks for all you have done before and all you will do in the weeks or months to come.

Independently from this PP Brad was at the school over last weekend and met with the appointed contractor. Mr. Winston Cyril of "RECS" is the designated builder and the project manager is from the community of Micoud. He has started with another termite treatment and is in the process of replacing the badly damaged T 1-11 at the back walls with metal siding. PP Brad was also able to secure the donation of a free suspended metal ceiling. They will meet with the school representative to finalize the electrical requirements.

Subsequently the Spoke Editor visited the site this week and some work has started.



parts of the badly damaged back wall were removed.

The initially required building material has been ordered by PP Brad and was expected for the site shortly. When passing by Micoud Secondary School on your way or to from Vieux Fort please fell free to stop by for a look at the progress.
