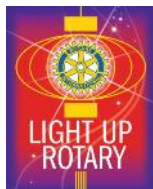

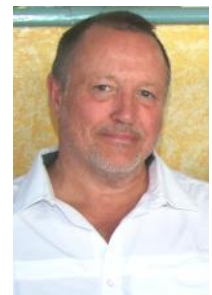

The tribute to the polio eradication effort qualified as a Guinness World Records-breaking achievement.





Rotaract update



On Thursday February 19, 2015 members of the Rotaract Club of Saint Lucia elected the new leadership for the Rotaract year 2015-16.

To participate in the election one had to be a member in good (financial) standing. That group was larger than it had been for years. Out of 28 members of the Rotaract Club of Saint Lucia 25 were present. Out of that number 23 members were eligible to cast their votes.

Up for election were all 8 new positions governing the affairs of the club. In attendance were also members of the sponsoring Rotary Club of Saint Lucia in PP Albert, Rot. Steve, PP Konrad and of course PE Timothy James

The election of officers is a very formal affair and Rotarians could well borrow a page or two from that book. Nominations for every position have to be officially opened and seconded, every nominee has to be proposed and seconded and nomination for every position is closed by a member via moving the motion and another member seconding it before secret balloting for each individual position is carried out. A somewhat lengthy but formal and most impressive process.

Results can at times be very close and in some cases campaigning took place leading up to the election day. Between casting and counting of votes there is often time for a little chat.
