Rotary and Rotaract workday at the Micoud Secondary School Library

A significant number of Rotarians and Rotaractors from our club and the Rotary and Rotaract Clubs of Saint Lucia South turned out on Saturday morning for the demolition work at the Micoud Secondary School. Members met at the Castries Central Library after 8.00 am and left Castries on time at 8.30 am.



Rotarians and Rotaractors came equipped with brooms shovels, crowbars, hammers of all sizes, a step ladder and a wheel barrow.

The task at hand was to remove all termite infested partitions within the freestanding building still seen in this picture.

The room partitions after being removed have to be burned to prevent further spreading of the termites. Once this is achieved the building will be treated accordingly and the reconstruction work can start. With the large number of volunteers landing a hand much of the removal work was completed.

School volunteers will now remove the remaining electrical installations before we can complete the removal of the ceiling.
