

In Dir Andre's absence IPP Konrad distributed Wine and Cheese Fiesta invitations to all members present. An appeal was made to take the responsibility of selling all 400 invitations seriously to ensure the financial success of the fundraiser.



At the outset of the meeting Pres Doddy provided an update on some general issues

Referring to the last board meeting held on Tuesday January 14, 2014 Pres. Doddy touched on:

- a possible project involving George V park and a number of young mainly from troubles single parent Households that are currently looked after during the day. Work would involved a structured assistance with the improvement to the facilities and support of these children
- the planed work at the Boys Training Centre in Massade, Gros Islet. Despite repeated visits to Gros Islet efforts to finalize a mutually beneficial approach with the Director of the Boys Training Centre have been without success. In Pres. Doddy's view the project, namely repairs to the fence can still be undertaken and efforts to touch base with Mr. Terrence will continue.
- the Rotary board has agreed in principle to help reestablishing the business of an amputee taylor in the Marc Area who had lost his machine and supplies in the recent floods. The plan is to purchase a new sewing machine and supply him with up to \$ 1000.00 of sewing supplies.

PP Charles pointed out that is was important his home and shop were in a condition to accommodate the new machine and material securely. This is to ensure the donation is not made in vain.

the planned 'Youth Symposium" now scheduled for February.
 Indicating that there seems to be a disconnect or gap between Young and Old the aim is to bring app. 50 young people together with Rotarians and civil leaders for an open symposium.

In moderated discussions ways to narrow the ever widening gap between the generations may be discussed. The possibility to afterwards hold a televised discussion or debate was tabled by Pres. Doddy. At that time Rot. Tim James proposed it may be best to involve the media from the outset in the forum and get PR exposure for the entire exercise.



Being a business meeting the Directors presented their report





Dir. David Schimeld - Service Projects

The Vocational Service Committee met earlier in the month and discussed were:

- the ongoing 4 way test sign project. It is proposed 2 new w way test signs should be erect in areas to be recommended by PP Azmina.
- the 3 names for the annual Vocational Award winning students will be obtained from SALCC. Rot Paul is following up on this matter
- the 4 way test is to be added to exercise books. Rot. Paul is looking into practical ways to achieve this with the Saint Lucia National Printing Company.
- at least 1 school is to be identified to receive a vocational talk from a member of the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia.
- Rot. Paul is to meet with all 3 Interact leaders to guide them on their vocational projects for the year.

Also the International Service Committee met their discussions focused on the following:

- practical ways to create a document that can be used to promote the values of Rotary fostering world under standing and peace.
- Possible ways to participate in the next RI conference in Sidney, Australia.
- possibilities to twin with other Rotary Clubs
- the importance of Rotarians to attend a Rotaract meeting. These are held every Thursday at the Central Library in Castries from 6.30 PM
- design a brochure to portray the goals and projects of the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia for distribution



Dir. Selma StPrix - Youth Services

- Dir Selma updated members on the ongoing efforts to reestablish the Interact Club at CCSS where a meeting with the school principal was scheduled for Monday January 20, 2014.
- Only the SJC Interact Club participated in the Rotary / ARC tree planting activity on December. 19, 2013
- Unfortunately Rotary did not get sufficient notice to participate in a feeding of homeless people in Castries organized by the Interact Club.
- Also specific individual Rotarians are no assigned to liaise with Rotaract and 1 Interact Club each.
- The MOU for the operation of The Rotary Bus has finally be signed by all parties involved in the operation of the vehicle. Also the insurance is in place despite outstanding payments from 2 of the organizations involved.

Rot. Timothy James and PP Malcolm had comments on the reports.

In particular PP Malcolm indicated that the Rotary Calabashers have been invited to perform at the RI Convention in Sidney. He has meanwhile been in contact with the SLTB and the diplomatic missions to explore practical ways promoting Saint Lucia with assistance of the SLTB and financial support from the international missions.

Unrelated to the report PP Charles asked about a CFL Community initiative he and IPP Konrad were advised off during a CFL 10th Anniversary event the previous week. IPP Konrad indicated that the project Submission documents are with Dir. Selma who is in the process of preparing a project paper for submission. And Rot. Pedro reminded all that there are as good as for every vocation a "special interest" affiliation with Rotary International.

Dir. Albert and Treasurer Lorne were absent from the meeting

At that time IPP Konrad voiced his concerns about the absence of the Treasurer and Treasurer's report for the last 2 meetings. There are several payments to be made urgently like the reimbursement of the travelling expenses to Peace Corp Volunteer and 1st. Move Chess coordinator Daniel Jasper who no urgently needs this money.
