That Friday the Assistant Governor paid the club an official visit to share some messages and goals of District Governor Elwin Atmodimedjo with the members of the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia.

ADG Tim started out by extending greetings from DG Elwin who will be visiting Saint Lucia in January 2015. Here are some of the topics touched on:

- Overall the Rotary Club of Saint Lucia is working well and meeting its Rotary International requirements.
- Pres. Chester was asked to consider a joint Rotary meeting for the DGs visit at the end of January
- Members were encouraged to use the RI website, <u>www.Rotary.</u>org There members can find extensive information on all projects Answers on many questions
 - and find endless training and information material, forms and suggestions for projects
- The new phrase "One Rotary" is emerging throughout the world of Rotary. It is being coined by RI to emphasize
 the togetherness and common goals of all Rotary Clubs across the world. This may not be a problem where our
 Saint Lucia clubs are in relative proximity but we should always keep our possibly smaller club in mind and be
 ready to assist where and when appropriate.
- Keep paying attention to Rotary and Rotaract. ADG Tim confirmed that we have exceptionally good rapport with our youth clubs and encouraged all to keep it up.
- Remember to hold club Assemblies and have them for the right reasons to keep them relevant. Ideal are 4 Assemblies per annum and 2 or 3 are a good effort.
- The same applies for Committee meetings. They are ever so important for a vibrant all members encompassing club. So make them work for the club's benefit.
- Please focus on next year's Board of Directors and President as well as a PN for 2016-17. These positions are supposed to be announced by mid December.
- Encourage members to attend District Conference in Suriname on April 8-11, 2015. It will be an amazing conference and experience to visit South America. All Rotarians should consider attending
- Also the RI Convention will be held in Sao Paolo from June 6-9, 2015. No member is a true Rotarian unless he/ she has attended at least one RI Convention. PP Charles has attended the last 5 RI Conventions and maybe it is time to pass on the mantle.
- The DG 2015-16 is from Barbados and his installation ceremony is most likely going to be held in Barbados around the end of June 2015. This will be a good opportunity to visit Barbados for some goo fellowship.
- An annual Presidents meeting will again be held and the club should consider sending the PE for 2015-16 to attend this important gathering

AG Tim concluded by thanking all Rotarians for their support and the good work they do.

WORLD POLIO DAY: HEALTH OFFICIALS LAUD POLIO ERADICATION ACHIEVEMENTS, POINT TO DISEASE'S ENDGAME

After a year of shrinking polio cases worldwide, the crippling disease is now on the cusp of being eradicated, said top health offi-cials at Rotary's second annual World Polio Day event on 24 October.

At a special <u>Livestream program</u> -- World Polio Day: Make History Today -- Rotary leaders joined global health experts and celebrity singers to hail the progress of the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u>. After nearly 30 years, the GPEI, which includes Rotary, the World Health Organization, UNICEF, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, is on the brink of ending polio by 2018, making it the second infectious disease to be eradicated. "A world within our grasp more than at any point in the past," said Tom Frieden, director of the CDC, during a video message to the audience. "The poliovirus continues to lose ground. Next month we will mark two years since the last case of wild poliovirus type 3, giving every appearance of eradication, and leaving only type 1 in the world."

The total number of global cases to date is 247, compared with 298 for the same period last year. Outside Pakistan, which saw its polio cases spike this year, the number of cases has been 35, a dramatic decrease from 187 a year ago. Pakistan accounts for 85, percent of global cases of polio this year, Frieden noted. Pakistan, along with Afghanistan and Nigeria, are three remaining polio endemic countries. The GPEI is on the verge of a major polio achievement in Nigeria. The country has registered only six cases to date this year. "Nigeria is in excellent position to stop circulation of polio this year," said Frieden. "It has gotten this close' to eradicating polio by a remarkable turnaround of the program, implementing an emergency operations center, developing a proactive approach to eradication, finding innovative ways to reach children in insecure areas." Frieden talked about how Nigeria's Polio Emergency Operations Center aided in the quick and effective response to the country's Ebola outbreak. Senior officials from the center were sent to Lagos to lead the effort. They opened an Ebola treatment unit and conducted contact tracing with up to 500 people per day. "In spite of these efforts, polio activities did not suffer," said Frieden. "This is the legacy of polio eradication in action, and it saved lives by successfully stopping the outbreak." Most of the polio cases in Afghanistan in 2014 are the result of reintroduction from Pakistan, said James Alexander, senior medical epidemiologist for the CDC. But the country has made significant progress the last two years because of the implementa-tion of its emergency action plan, he said. "To ensure progress in 2015, there needs to be engagement with new national leadership, intensified focus on 'missed' children, and econtinued dialogue with other - countries, "Alexander told attendees.
