MEMBERSHIP & EXTENSION MONTH

IDEAS TO DEVELOP MEMBERSHIP RETENTION & RECRUITMENT STRATEGIES

August is membership and club development month, a time to focus on and appreciate your members, celebrate their devotion to the club and the impact they have made. It's also a time to think about developing strategies around growing your membership. The reason why Rotary is such a successful organization is because it is full of members that have one trait in common – the passion to make a difference in the world. All of us share this passion and it's what drives us to work together.

Today, a growing population of youth are not even aware of what the organization is or does while those that do are unable to join for a variety of reasons. Granted, we've made many changes to combat this challenge such as the introduction of eClubs, relaxed attendance requirements, more meeting time options, etc. but we still have ways to go. Members continue to leave and clubs continue to struggle to recruit.

This year, with members in mind, why not create a development and recruitment strategy by implementing methods your club hasn't tried before.

Membership Development

- 1. Analyze results from past exit interviews to see what members cited as their reason for leaving the club. Often, you can immediately see a pattern to act upon.
- 2.If your club doesn't conduct exit interviews, consider contacting ex-members from the past few years to ask them for feedback on what they feel the club could've done better.
- 3. Make sure every member has some role to play. Every member in your club joined to become part of something big, and if they aren't being given a chance to make a contribution to the club, slowly but surely, their satisfaction level will begin to decline. Consider giving each member some sort of responsibility at every meeting (ex: introduce/thank speaker, contribute jokes of the week for the club newsletter, etc.).
- 4. Focus on happiness: happy members are those that are motivated to do good for the club. There are many ways to keep members happy. Sometimes just being asked means a lot, so in your next meeting, have every member anonymously write changes that they would like to see in the club which would make them happy. Such a simple act shows your members that you care about their presence in the club.

Recruitment Strategies

Even though your club may have an open door policy, many prospective members interested in joining still might be hesitant to come visit. The answer?

Promote your open door policy everywhere you can – on your website, social media and even at your meeting location (example, at the entrance of the building, near the elevators, staircase, etc.)

Put up flyers welcoming visitors pointing them to where you meet, time, etc. The more signs prospective members see, the more you've alleviated their fear of trying something new.

Countries like Germany, India, Africa have all seen an increase in membership due to the emphasis they've put on personal connections. Rotarians here have been urging family members to join and have even created new clubs that meet in the evenings and have lower fees for the children of all members. This makes it easier for parents to balance family life with club service.

- 1. All of us know at least one person that might be a good fit for Rotary, whether that person be a colleague, family member or friend all we have to do is ask.
- 2. Many Rotaractors tend to leave Rotary altogether. Team up with a local Rotaract club and speak more on the benefits of joining your club, so that you can create a smooth transition for them to join your club when they are ready.

Other ideas to try include:

- 1. Propose a 'trial' period offer a 3 month membership plan where members can pay only for those months to get a better feel for what it means to be part of your club. This way, they don't have to worry about investing money/time for the entire year.
- 2. Create a club designation to recognize members that recruit the most members. Then for every 2 or 3 new members that join, the recruiter receives the special club designation title. Plus take advantage of Rotary's New Member Sponsor Program.
- 3. Host an open house and promote it via Facebook ads. You can set your own budget and reach a wider audience.
- 4. List the benefits of joining your club right on your site. Add a video showcasing the fun your members have so as to evoke a feeling of being part of a team.
- 5. Ask your guests and speakers to join your club, even if they choose to join as honorary members.

Most importantly, follow up with all of your prospective members. You can now add all your prospective members into your contacts list, so following up is easy. Send a personal note reminding them of their interest in the club and reinforce the benefits. At the end of the day, it's up to us to open the door to new members by asking people to join. What's your membership goal this year?

The Rotary Club of Saint Lucia hosted its weekly meetings via the zoom platform and one hybrid session where the Covid-19 protocols are followed. Unicomer invited the RSCL to partner with them for this initiative; the RCSL was supposed to assist with the distribution of supplies and for the mentorship component to the parents attending the fair.



For Membership month, our own IPP Leathon Khan was the Guest Speaker at Rotary Grand Turk's General Meeting. RCSL's Guest Speakers were Dr. Cletus Bertin and District Governor Sonya Alleyne who spoke on Charting Pathways: From Purpose to People and Membership, respectively.

The session entailed presentation on Charting Pathways: From Purpose to People. These steps include:

Purpose
Priorities
Passion
Preparation
Perseverance
Patience
People

Dr. Bertin gave a synopsis of each stage and how it transitions from one to the other. He posed thought provoking questions and statements. Highlights include finding and fulfilling your life's purpose, the differences between fulfillment and acheivement, success and significance etc.

District Governor Sonya Alleyne

The DG gave a motivational speech about membership in general. She conveyed her appreciation for the RSCL and stated that she enjoys attending our sessions. She spoke about the importance of member retention. We need to figure out how to get members to participate; make our meetings exciting and informative.

She stated that the COVID 19 pandemic should not be used as a reason to not recruit new Rotarians to the club. We should do everything we can to reach out to people who exhibit Rotary traits, as PP Malcolm would say, "you are a Rotarian before you are a Rotarian."

She also stated that a true Rotarian is one who covers their expenses. There should be no unpaid invoices among Rotarians. If this happens, talk to a member or the Treasurer about making payment arrangements, but never ignore it.

In the seventies and early eighties we were involved in many construction projects :-

Dunnottar School – the building had two apartments which were converted to house a school for children with special needs. Several years later a technical building was added.

Laundry, Shower, Toilet Units - designed in association with Rockefeller Research & Control and 32 were built throughout the island, 5 of them by the Rotary Club of St.Lucia South. The purpose of these units was to have people use these facilities instead of using the rivers for laundry, shower and toilet purposes. By not entering the rivers, persons avoided contacting bilharzia, a disease affecting millions of people in the tropics.

Upton Gardens Girls' Centre - Plumbing improvements and supply of furniture.

Laborie Primary School - The steel frame was donated by a Canadian company, ARMCO, and CIDA funded the work on site along with the Rotary Club of Guelph (with whom we were twinned) and a local church group.

Apostles Battery on Morne Fortune - resolved a drainage problem in the underground rooms.

More recently, along with the Rotary Club of Gros Islet, we built an extension to the maternity wing at St.Judes Hospital in Vieux Fort and also a 150,000 gallon water storage tank at Plateau.

Micoud Secondary School - conversion of a building to house computer facilities and a library.

I am happy to say that my membership of the Rotary Club of St.Lucia has enabled me to use my experience of building construction to participate meaningfully in many of the club's projects. These projects were designed to benefit local communities so I am pleased that Rotary gave me a chance to contribute to them.

ASSISTANCE TO WORLD PEDIATRIC PROJECT (WPP)

AUGUST 08TH 2021

Members of the Rotary Club have in the past supported the WPP Word Paediatric Project. Members help with accommodating the visiting team of medical professionals and for example Past Honorary Rotarian Dr. Stephen King sponsors the COVID tests. 'With strong support and leadership from local health providers and the Ministry of Health and Wellness, WPP continues to develop its programs and network in St. Lucia to build access to advanced care for the island's children. WPP's Eastern Caribbean programs first expanded to St. Lucia in 2008 and the island is now one of WPP's most committed partners, with robust training initiatives, annual outreach screening clinics, and an active international referral network. Impact on Saint Lucia:

- US\$ 23,245,000+ in medical services provided
- 1,695 children served
- 150 surgical and diagnostic medical teams coordinated



SAFETY DURING THE OUTBREAK

Can I get vaccinated against COVID-19 while I am currently sick with COVID-19?

No. People with COVID-19 who have symptoms should wait to be vaccinated until they have recovered from their illness and have met the criteria for discontinuing isolation; those without symptoms should also wait until they meet the criteria before getting vaccinated. This guidance also applies to people who get COVID-19 before getting their second dose of vaccine.

If I am pregnant, can I get a COVID-19 vaccine?

Yes, COVID-19 vaccination is recommended for all people 12 years and older, including people who are pregnant, breastfeeding, trying to get pregnant now, or might become pregnant in the future. You might want to have a conversation with your healthcare provider about COVID-19 vaccination. While such a conversation might be helpful, it is not required before vaccination. Learn more about vaccination considerations for people who are pregnant or breastfeeding.

If you are pregnant and have received a COVID-19 vaccine, we encourage you to enroll in v-safe, CDC's smartphone-based tool that provides personalized health check-ins after vaccination. A v-safe pregnancy registry has been established to gather information on the health of pregnant people who have received a COVID-19 vaccine.


