The ROTARY CLUB OF SAINT LUCIA- 'CAREGIVER PROGRAM'

What started off in recent years as an 'informal gathering' of Rotarians after the 'closing toast' of Rotary Club of Saint Lucia weekly Meetings, was an impromptu extended fellowship, to discuss matters of general interest to the island community ,which over time became known as the 'After Meeting Fellowship' (AMF) .Among the subjects emanating from a series of topics from that 'informal ' grouping, was an idea to provide some form of inclusion to members of the Rotary family ,who had become 'SHUT -INS' by virtue of Ill Health, Disability, Age , Financial, Economic and other circumstances, which prevented them from active engagement in the activities of their Rotary Club. A Rotary Seniors 'Care Giver Project' proposal was initially tabled with Rotary at its highest levels, including a visit by PAG Dr Malcolm Charles, to the then District Governor, seeking to obtain 'agreement in principle' for the inclusion of the Care Giver Program in the activities of The Rotary Club of Saint Lucia.

To date, the 'AMF Committee' has drafted a 50 plus page Manual of Procedure' to serve as a guide to the future 'modus operandi' of the volunteer program, which model had apparently been 'gaining traction', with sister Rotary Clubs in District 7030.

While the 'finishing touches' are being put to the procedure Manual, the intention is for the 'AMF' Rotary Care Giver program to ultimately be established as a 'functional sub Committee' of the standard 'Club Administration or Membership Committees' of a Rotary Club. Apart from members of the AMF sub Committee, Credits in the creation of the Rotary Caregiver Program, are extended to Dr Janeen Payne, Pres Leathon Khan, PP Leevie Herelle and PP Dr Malcolm Charles.
