

What is your Rotary Club doing to focus your efforts on Disease Prevention and Treatment?

December is Disease Prevention and Treatment Month on the Rotary Calendar.

This is one of the Foundations Areas of Focus and one in which many of us would be aware of the numerous projects around the world supported by clubs and the Foundation. Look at your role in promoting improved health at home and abroad and supporting these vital programs that contribute not only to healthy communities but peaceful communities.

Disease prevention and treatment takes on many forms, from supporting studies to helping immunize people to improving drinking water and the sanitation infrastructure. The world relies on Rotary to tackle these global challenges, and to set an example for others to follow.

We believe good health care is everyone's right. Yet 400 million people in the world can't afford or don't have access to basic health care.

Disease results in misery, pain, and poverty for millions of people worldwide. That's why treating and preventing disease is so important to us. We lead efforts both large and small. We set up temporary clinics, blood donation centers, and training facilities in underserved communities struggling with outbreaks and health care access. We design and build infrastructure that allows doctors, patients, and governments to work together.

Our members combat diseases like malaria, HIV/AIDS, Alzheimer's, multiple sclerosis, diabetes, and polio. Prevention is important, which is why we also focus on health education and bringing people routine hearing, vision, and dental care.

#### HOW ROTARY MAKES HELP HAPPEN

We educate and equip communities to stop the spread of life-threatening diseases. Rotary members have hundreds of health projects underway around the world at any given time.

The Rotary Club of Saint Lucia hosted its weekly meetings via the zoom platform. Our monthly Board Meetings and Business Meetings happened as planned.



Furthermore, the RCSL held its Christmas Lunch at the NSDC on December 17th which was supported by both members and guests.

The treatment must always be focused on specific diseases that the human body may suffer from. And to see the individual as a whole; including them in their management. It may also involve a change in diet and exercise as well as medication or therapy. The use of vaccines was also reviewed in helping to prevent many diseases historically including the now present Sars COVID-19 virus.

Doctor Simmons then continued to elaborate on contributions made by Rotary both locally and abroad.

# Chartered Accountants Recognise Frank Myers

THE Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Eastern Caribbean (ICAEC) has presented Mr. Frank Vernon Myers with an award recognizing his Outstanding Contribution and Continued Support for the Accounting Profession in Saint Lucia and the Eastern Caribbean.

The award was presented at the closing cocktail for Accountants' Week which was celebrated throughout the Eastern Caribbean from Nov 21st - 27th 2021, with a series of events for members of the ICAFC. Non-members were also invited.

Frank has been involved in the progression of the accounting profession since 1992 when he was elected president of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Spirit Lucia (ICASL). He forged a new direction for the profession to Saint Lucia, with members of the Institute being seen as district from unqualified accountants. In 1996, the separation of qualified accountants became law when one of the key amendments to the 1985 Act governing the Institute was the restriction of the title "Chartered Accountant" (of St. Lucia) to members of the Institute only, and the restriction to public practice to Chartered Accountants only. His efforts in this Initiative was instrumental in the occountancy profession being rightly accorded the same standing and respect as the traditional professions in the island (medicine, law and engineering).

Frank was also integral in the humening of the fastitute of Chartered Accountants of the Eastern Carribbeau (ICAEC), which subsumed the ICAST, and the other institutes then established in the sub-region, and in September 2004 was elected as the first Secretary of that body. In July 2006, he was elected president of ICAEC, a position he held up to 2015. Under his presidency, the ICAEC commenced the implementation of the Institute's Operations and Quality Assurance assurad, a project that was funded by the World Bank and facilitated by the






