A significant development during the month of May was the official Launch of our Strategic Alliance with Toastmasters and our friendly Speech Competition to mark the occasion. This took place on Saturday May 15 and was in keeping with the establishment of a worldwide strategic partnership between Rotary International and Toastmasters International.

Going forward, both organizations will seek to collaborate in areas of communications skills and leadership development, as well as joint engagements in certain community service projects. Although the judges’ decisions for the Speech Competition were not what we expected, the Rotary Speech Team delivered exceptional performances! We should all work together to support this initiative and make this alliance a fruitful and productive relationship.

Our club seized on the opportunity to partner with the health authorities in their national efforts to combat the spread of Covid-19 and to increase the number of people being vaccinated. This was done using our Mobile Youth Clinic by offering vaccinations in several remote areas where vaccinations are not readily available. This initiative has been working very well and has attracted national attention. Kudos to VP Selma St. Prix for driving this.

The month of May was also marked by the hosting of a very well attended Club Assembly on May 20. This was our best attendance at a meeting for the year so far. This has been taken as an expression of renewed interest in the affairs and activities of the club. It is hope that as the new Administration assumes office on July 1st, that this same level of engagement and enthusiasm will continue. This will be necessary for our club to sustain its momentum and drive as we continue to face anticipated challenges ahead. This is what will carry us through. 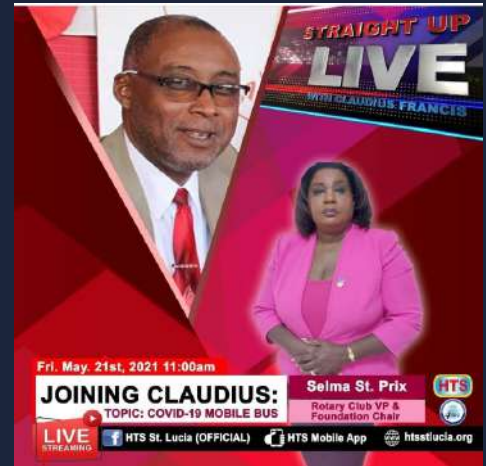
## ROTARY MOBILE CLINIC

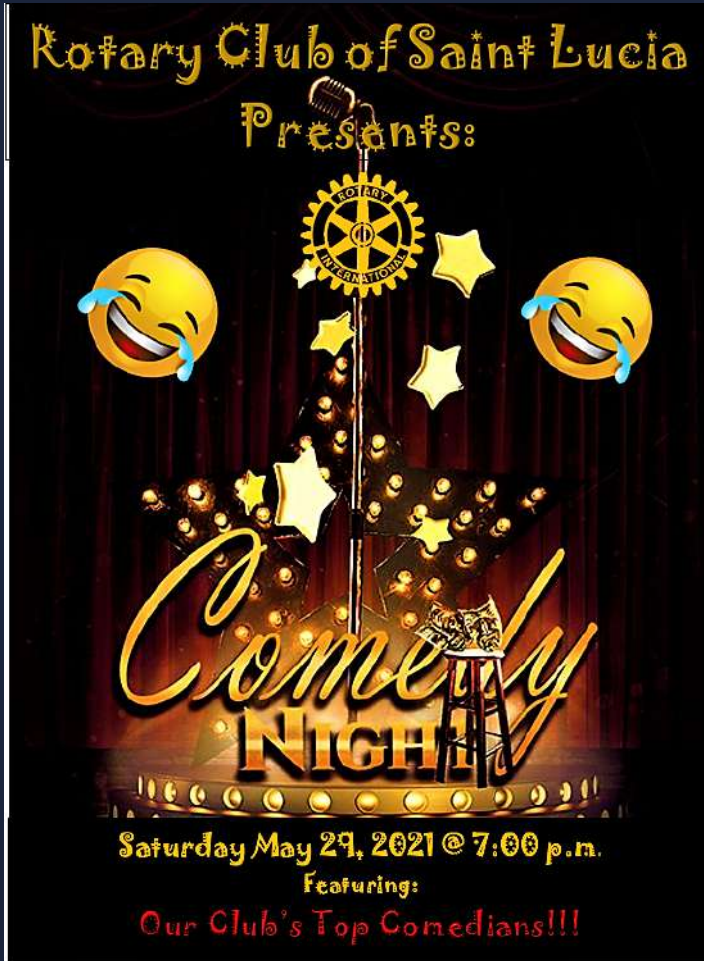

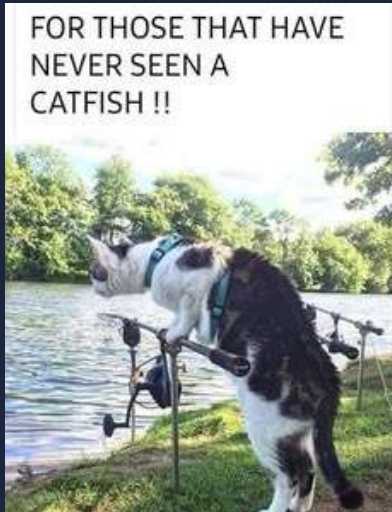
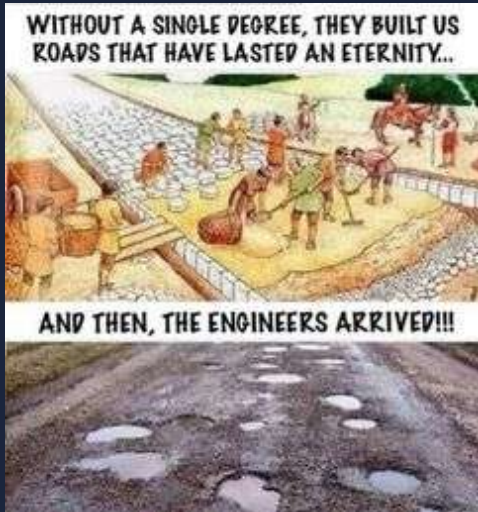

# SAFETY DURING THE OUTBREAK

## Watch for Symptoms

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

Fever or chills  
Cough  
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing  
Fatigue  
Muscle or body aches  
Headache  
New loss of taste or smell  
Sore throat  
Congestion or runny nose  
Nausea or vomiting  
Diarrhea

This list does not include all possible symptoms. CDC will continue to update this list as we learn more about COVID-19. Older adults and people who have severe underlying medical conditions like heart or lung disease or diabetes seem to be at higher risk for developing more serious complications from COVID-19 illness.
