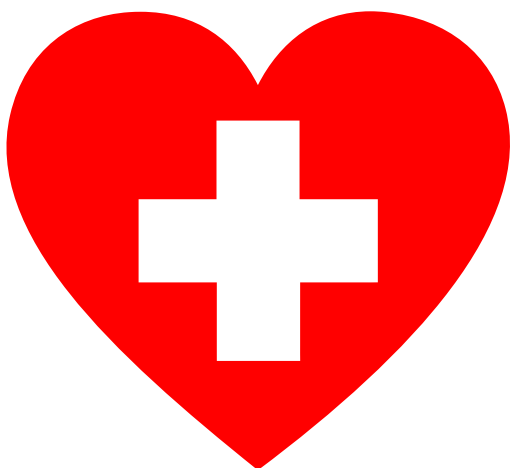
RCSL celebrated foundation month not only by giving but also by inviting two guest speakers during the month of November

Dr Olu Ogunlusi

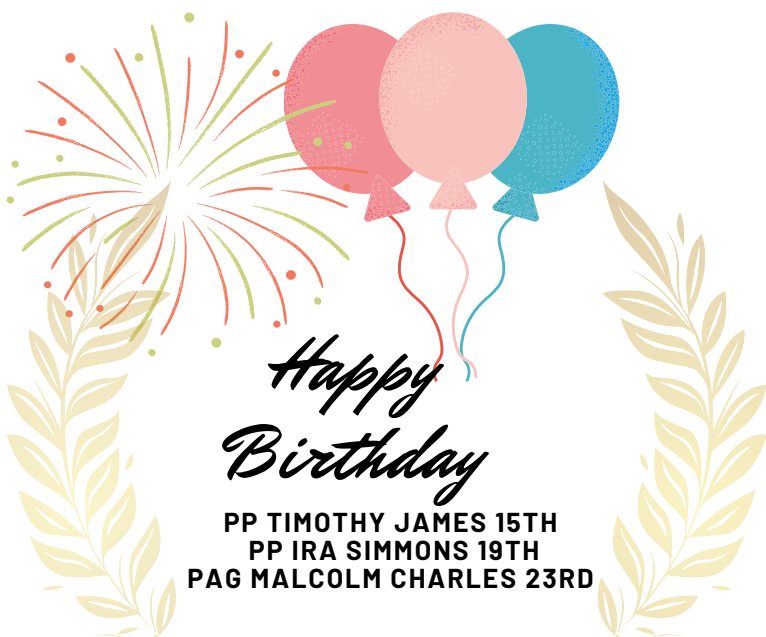

Notable Activities On Display

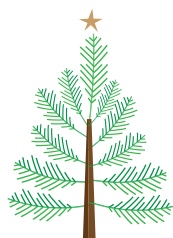
The Rotary Club of Saint Lucia was the recipient of a very generous donation of over 300 pairs of "Crocs" shoes from the TOCO Foundation.
