
WHAT BEING A MOM REALLY MEANS



YOUTH SERVICES COMMITTEE PRESENTS GIRLS IN ICT DAY

APRIL 28TH-29TH 2022

28 April, International Girls in ICT Day, established by International Telecommunications Union (ITU) and celebrated in over 150 countries around the world, celebrates girls and young women and encourages them to pursue studies and careers in the technology sector through training of coding, development of mobile applications and IT.

The Interact Clubs (Sir Arthur Lewis Community College, St. Joseph's Convent and Castries Comprehensive Secondary School) benefited from two one-day workshops under the theme Access and Safety: cybersecurity. This workshop was held by the National Telecommunications Regulatory Commission (NTRC).

Cybersecurity is the state or process of protecting and recovering computer systems, networks, devices, and programs from any type of cyber-attack. Whether you are an individual, small business or large cooperation, we are becoming increasingly reliant on technology, it is important to keep our data protected. A lack of focus on cybersecurity can damage your business in a range of ways such as economic costs, reputational costs and regulatory costs.

In 1986 he graduated with an Honours degree in Economics, Management and Accounting.

He returned to St. Lucia and was appointed Senior Accountant in the Ministry of Education and then the Ministry of Finance. He then pursued Post Graduate studies in Management. In 1990 he was transferred to the Inland Revenue Department where he pursued Tax Accounting. He attended numerous courses in Canada, USA, UK and the Caribbean. In 1996, he decided to pursue Law in the UK. He then went on to London School of Economics to complete a Masters in Law – Tax & Corporate Law. Lorenzo returned to St. Lucia in 2000 and joined the firm of Larcher, Barnard, Taylor and Walters. In 2004 he took up a job offer from the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank as Senior Legal Advisor in Bank Supervision.

Doddy is a regionalist having worked with most Governments in the Caribbean. He is well known throughout the Caribbean as a professional and dedicated to regional integration. Doddy is also an avid sportsman having played at the national level in Cricket, Volleyball, Hockey, and Basketball. He is a grassroots man having spent his life in Faux a Chaud, the Morne and Ciceron area. He is a community worker. 

The Rotary Club of St. Lucia embarked on an 'Empower Girls' initiative with approximately 200 girls. The main aim of the initiative was to empower girls across the globe by providing self-awareness and career guidance. The sessions commenced with three schools where there were interactors and one school where there is a potential for an interact club to be formed. Each school had to come up with an initiative that would be sustainable and can be utilized to empower other young girls. The Interactors were given the opportunity to present their initiatives and the sessions were concluded with a grand lunch and fellowship.



From the inception of the launch of the Childhood Obesity project the Rotary Club of St. Lucia brain stormed a number of initiatives to bring about awareness and to help curb childhood obesity in St Lucia. The initiatives chosen were a fellowship fun walk from Mega J to Pigeon Pointe on Sunday March 6, 2022 (600km) and vegetable kitchen gardens. The gardens were cultivated by children with supervision from their parents and monitoring and evaluating from the Rotary Club of St. Lucia. On a daily basis the participants would water the plants as a form of exercise and would prune on a needs basis. This is to encourage healthy eating which would in turn contribute to healthy styles.


