Rotary District 7030's "Shine Bright Like a Diamond" Awards Ceremony was held on Monday, June 27, 2022.


District Governor Sonya Alleyne honored numerous Clubs and Rotarians for their excellence throughout the evening.

SUCCESSION PLANNING

JUNE 21ST 2022



Succession planning is a process for identifying and developing members with the potential to fill key leadership positions in the organization/club.

It is important to maintain a system of recruitment, training, and replacement to ensure long-term investment in leadership talent.

IPP Leathon highlighted some important points really gives the concept meaning in the snippet below.

A few questions we may need to consider in putting our succession plans together are:

- 1. How will the club develop and nurture its future leaders? (Understudy programme? /mentorship? /assign responsibilities early to get people engaged as soon as possible?)
- 2. How will we assure a continuing sequence of competent people to assume leadership when current leaders move on? (Concerted effort to target "certain" people? /set quotas?/Stick to old & proven traditions?/revise criteria & desired personal qualities that we are looking for in prospective members?) I'm simply asking the questions here.....I'm not necessarily recommending any particular action. I'm interested in what our members think.
- 3. How will we plan the Club's future without some assurance that key positions will be filled? (convince each member they have a duty to serve and that the club also has an expectation that they will serve?/convince competent Directors and Officers to serve at least 2 terms consecutively?.....there is some merit in this for certain roles e.g. Treasurer (Andre and Alan and several others are a cases in point/Community Services....depending on continuity of multi-year projects?).
- 4. We must therefore ensure that we align as much as possible our Succession Plans with our broader Strategic Plan because this is where in large measure, the future of our Club gets determined and this is where a certain level of discipline is instilled in what we do and how we go about doing it.
- 5. Quotation by Benjamin Franklin, one of Americas most famous Founding Fathers: "If you fail to plan, you are planning to fail". This is a simple but profound statement that says it all when it comes to planning.

In recent years it represents key moments of national significance. Together at the same time with all commonwealth countries, we will light the beacon in celebration of the record breaking queen's 70th reign. Caribbean SEA is Now WaterWays!

Caribbean Student Environmental Alliance (SEA) began its work at Ciceron Secondary School in 2004 under the watchful eyes of the principal, Ron Isaac, and in partnership with Carilec, Lucelec, Solid Waste Management, and Sustainable Development. That initial project was a great success, and Caribbean SEA launched! Fast forward to post-pandemic restrictions, and Caribbean SEA celebrated World Environment Day and World Oceans Day with a weeklong series of events to initiate our rebranding to WaterWays. Our Board of Directors saw the need to rebrand ourselves to better represent what we do and our mission; thus, the name was changed to WaterWays in 2019 in the US, and now we have officially changed our name for our Caribbean chapter to WaterWays in Saint Lucia. The events all focused on our mission of empowering youth and community members to protect and restore the waterways where they live, work, and play. Our Young Professionals Advisory Board was instrumental to the success of our rebranding, hosting the Trivia Night at the Yacht Club and assisting with all of the other events!

We began the events on Friday, June 3^{rt,} by announcing an island-wide Treasure Hunt.


