

What is Rotary?

Founded as America's first service club in 1905, Rotary today has over 34,000 clubs worldwide providing community leadership in many forms. Some of its 1.2 million members may be delivering polio vaccine to children in India, water purification units in Africa or clothing and food to underprivileged in America.

How did a non-governmental organization started by a young attorney (Paul Harris), in a cramped Chicago office, accomplish this? Rotarians networking in many ways prove that the sun never sets on Rotary's activities.

Rotary's motto, *Service above Self*, is demonstrated by its polio campaign. Once a dreaded childhood disease Polio crippled and killed thousands of people worldwide. In 1985, Rotary International decided to provide the polio vaccine to rid the world of this gruesome disease. Working with the World Health Organization and others, Rotary basically achieved its goal to wipe out polio.

The Wall Street Journal wrote, "Rotary's unsung polio effort deserves the Nobel Prize."

Rotary Club of East Wichita

Organized in 1984, we have over 100 members. We meet at the Wichita Country Club on Wednesdays at noon for approximately an hour. We encourage regular attendance, visiting other clubs and participating in our club's events and service projects. Dues are \$410 every six months, billed for Jan. 1 — June 30 and again, July 1—December 31 of each year. Members are expected to pay dues promptly when billed.

Who is eligible for Rotary?

We seek men and women who have demonstrated leadership skills in their field or community. A member should strive to attend 60% of our weekly noon meetings and participate in at least one volunteer opportunity each year. Because we value Rotary's history and traditions, a new member must attend an orientation session, offered periodically throughout the year. All membership applications must be approved by the board of directors prior to a 7-day review by the entire membership.

THIS Is What We Do!

- Our Club provides strong leadership and financial support for several community organizations in Wichita. Members have donated thousands of dollars for operations and capital campaigns of these organizations and have served on the organizations' board of directors. Other members have mentored students or provided countless hours of volunteerism in the community. Many local organizations have benefitted from our Club's volunteer efforts and monetary support. - Several \$1,000 college scholarships are awarded annually to area students. After the initial scholarship, students receive \$1,000 for three ensuing years, provided they maintain satisfactory grades. Scholarship recipients attend our Club's meetings annually to tell us about their educational pursuits.

- _____ **Regular Membership**—Dues are \$410 semi-annually (\$820 per year) covering all lunch meetings and club expenses. There is a one-time new member fee of \$100. This membership category is open to all applicants.
- _____ **Young Professional**—Must be under 40 years of age.
\$300/year membership fee (no new member fee) paid in full with initial invoice.
 - 12 Meals included (one per month) – meals in addition to the 12 would be pay-as-you-go at our standard rate of \$16.
 - Required minimum 50% involvement among meeting attendance, service projects and mixers – combined.
 - Maximum term is 2 years and then member must become full-paying member
- _____ **Senior Active**—Must meet one of the three requirements (age 70, retired from one's profession, **OR** have second home in another state where you spend 6 months or more of the year)
 - Half of regular membership dues (therefore, \$205 semi-annually) ; there is a one-time new member fee of \$100. Pay for all meals that you attend at our standard rate of \$16. One can change this status between regular and senior active status each semi-annual period, depending on how many meetings you project to attend in that six month period
